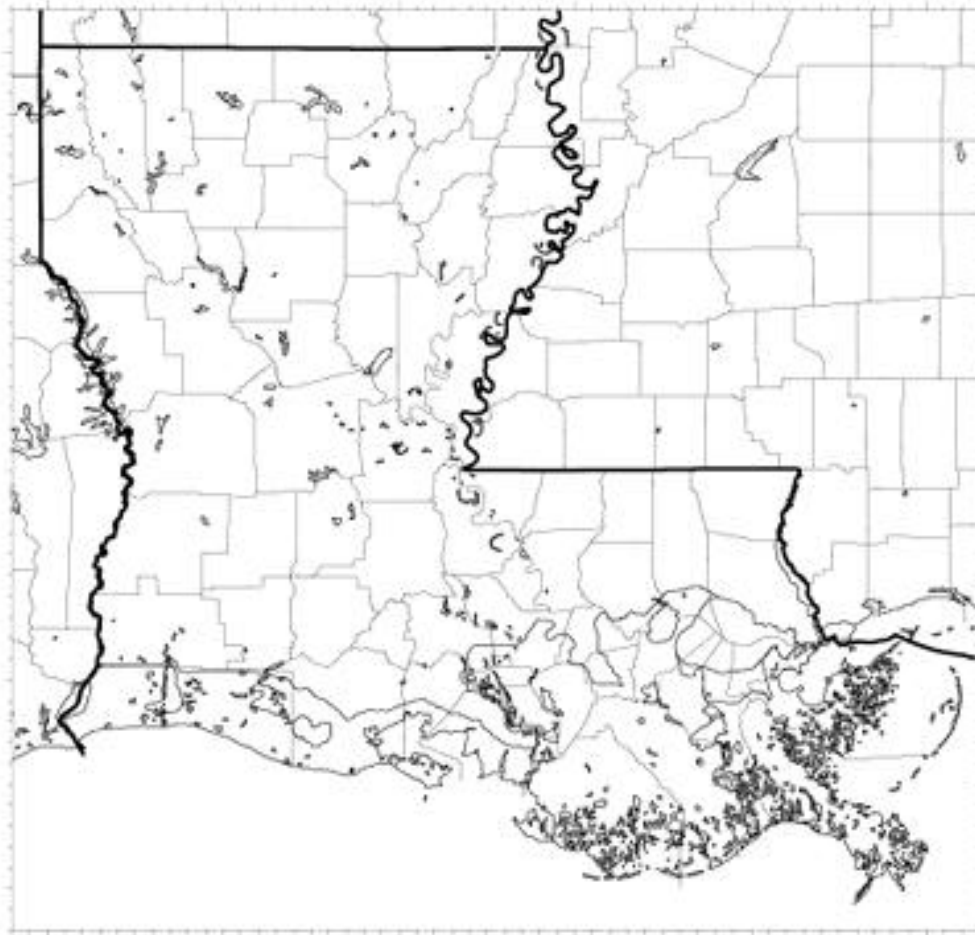

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## **INTRODUCTION**

The Annual Report of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, for the year beginning January 1, 2002 and ending December 31, 2002, has been prepared in accord with L.R.S. 37:911 et seq., particularly L.R.S. 37:918. I., which provides that the Board shall "publish an annual report for distribution to the Governor and Legislature."

During 2002, the Board of Nursing met a total of fifteen (15) days in Board meetings, including four (4) days of open business sessions, nine (9) days of closed disciplinary sessions, two (2) days of special call meetings. In addition, the Board met a total of eight (8) days in Committee Meetings, including four (4) Administrative Committee Meetings, three (3) Credentialing Committee Meetings, four (4) Education Committee Meetings, two (2) Compliance Committee Meetings, and four (4) Practice Committee Meetings. Members of the Board met a total of eight (8) days for Disciplinary Settlement Hearings. The actions taken at these meetings are reported among the activities of the Board.

In addition to the activities of the Board, the Report presents the current organization of the Board of Nursing, as well as the goals and objectives of the Board and the significant activities of the Board's professional staff. Statistical data depicting the current status of the Board approved nursing education programs are presented in tabulated form for each reference. Also depicted in the statistical data are characteristics of the licensee population.

The intent of the 2002 Annual Report is to document objective data that can be used in planning and decision-making relative to nursing.

### **MISSION STATEMENT**

To safeguard the life and health of the citizens of Louisiana by assuring persons practicing as registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses are competent and safe.

### **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

#### **Goal I: Promote regulatory effectiveness.**

##### **Objectives:**

1. Identify performance indicators for each major function, incorporating national benchmarking: licensing (RN & APRN); approval of educational programs; practice standards; compliance processes; and Recovery Nurse Program.
2. Develop and implement tools for measuring performance and continuous quality improvement.
3. Evaluate the regulatory effectiveness of jurisdiction over student nurses.
4. Develop system for criminal background checks on all applicants for clinical nursing courses.
5. Develop processes for verifying standards in Chapter 45 for programs preparing graduates for APRN licensure.
6. Use survey results from National Council State Boards of Nursing Excellence Project to improve services.

#### **Goal II: Assure efficient and timely responses to nursing issues affecting patient safety.**

1. Fully implement and evaluate priority system.
2. Develop and implement tools to facilitate investigative process.
3. Revise disciplinary section guidelines.
4. Revise policy regarding delay/denial of licensure.
5. Evaluate the regional system.

**Goal III: Enhance image and visibility of the Board.**

1. Provide presentations to undergraduate and graduate students in nursing programs.
2. Complete needs assessment to determine learning needs/interest of licensees as related to Board functions.
3. Conduct educational programs regionally to meet learning needs/interests of licenses as identified above.
4. Identify and enhance new means of communication/information sharing in addition to the Examiner.
5. Participate in liaison activities with other interested groups.
6. Initiate program to improve the communication/customer service of all office staff with the public.

**Goal IV: Identify and regulate evolving role of the registered nurse and advanced practice registered nurse as a professional while protecting the public.**

1. Complete the credentialing standards and promulgation of the rules for controlled substances for APRNs.
2. Evaluate the emerging roles of APRNs.
3. Explore the differentiation of nursing roles in accordance with educational preparation.
4. Identify critical patient safety issues related to the accessibility of properly prepared registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses and work collectively with nursing organizations, healthcare providers and other regulatory agencies to resolve.
5. Identify, analyze, and disseminate ongoing changes to RN scope of practice to consumers.

**Goal V: Facilitate board and staff development.**

1. Develop a self-assessment process for board members and staff.
2. Support the continuous development of board and staff.
3. Support and embrace the strategic plan.
4. Evaluate orientation plan for new board members.
5. Establish mechanisms for improving internal communications.

**Adopted** the proposed amendments to LAC 46:XLVII.3329, for rulemaking

**Adopted** the proposed revisions to LAC 46:XLVII.3329.D.Temporary Permits for rulemaking

and that staff be allowed to make editorial changes based on review by the Board's attorney, Wade Shows.

**Approved** the request that the Certified Hospice and Palliative Nurse (CHPN) designation be added to the list of certifications that are acceptable for Registered Nurse continuing education requirements for relicensure.

**Denied** approval of the ANCC clinical nurse specialist in advanced diabetes management certification exam and the ANCC nurse practitioner in advanced diabetes management certification exam as a basis for APRN licensure; and

**Approved** the ANCC clinical nurse specialist and nurse practitioner in advanced diabetes designation to be added to the list of certifications that are acceptable for Registered Nurse continuing education requirements for relicensure.

**Approved** for emergency rulemaking and accepted for rulemaking the changes to LAC 46:XLVII.3329 to allow lapsed grandfathered APRNs to apply for temporary permits for the purpose of reinstatement and LAC 46:XLVII.4507 to allow individuals with lapsed grandfathered APRN status to apply for a six (6) month temporary permit and to practice under the temporary permit for the required 300 hours of clinical practice per year with editorial revisions.

**Approved** the proposed revisions to LAC 46:XLVII.3329 and LAC 46:XLVII.4507 for rulemaking with editorial revisions.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for Nicholls State University, BSN Program and continued “full approval” status and commended them for 100% pass rate for first time writers on the NCLEX-RN for 2001.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for Dillard University, BSN Program and restored “full approval” status based on an NCLEX-RN pass rate of 93.7% for 2001.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for Louisiana College, BSN Program and restored “full approval” status based on an NCLEX-RN pass rate of 91.6% for 2001.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for McNeese State University, ADN Program and placed on “conditional approval” status based on an NCLEX-RN pass rate of 75% for 2001.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for Grambling State University, BSN Program and placed on “conditional approval” status based on an NCLEX-RN pass rate of 75.5% for 2001.

**Accepted** the 2000-2001 Annual Report for UL at Monroe, BSN Program and continued the "full approval" status of the nursing program. Furthermore, the Board recognizes that ULM is not in compliance with LAC 46:XLVII.3515B.8. *The number of faculty exceptions shall not exceed 20 percent of the number of full time nurse faculty employed (not FTE) in the program.* Annual report indicated that for fall 2001 faculty exceptions were 24.1% and for Spring 2002, 16% faculty exceptions. In the future, non-compliance with this standard may lead to a change in approval status.

**Approved** the minor curriculum changes requested for McNeese State University.

**Accepted** the joint report of LSBN/NLNAC site-visit of Dillard University on October 30-November 1, 2001 and granted continued “full approval” status.

**Re-approved** Alcorn State University, BSN Program, Natchez, MS utilization of Louisiana clinical facilities at East Louisiana State Hospital in Jackson, for clinical experiences for the requested rotation.

**Delayed** request by William E. Sullivan for recognition of credentials to fulfill faculty qualifications, and referred back to Education Committee for further action.

**Recognized** William E. Sullivan’s masters in nursing as compliant with the rule that specifies a baccalaureate and a master in nursing for eligibility to teach in a program in Louisiana preparing graduates for RN licensure. The specific action by the Board is to grant the request for recognition of having educational preparation equivalent to a baccalaureate and a master in nursing. It is understood that should he apply for a faculty position in Louisiana, official transcripts will be reviewed to assure that information submitted is consistent with that which was reported for review.

**Accepted** the January 30-February 1, 2002 Site-visit Report of Baton Rouge General Medical Center School of Nursing and grant continuing " full approval" to the nursing program with three suggestions and two recommendations. Recommendations are to be reported on in the 2001-2002 Annual Report.

Suggestions:

1. That the framework articulate the professional standards that guide the program goals.
2. That funds be allocated for faculty participation in conferences and workshops to assure knowledge of trends and developments in nursing and nursing education.
3. Analyze the need for support staff as one person for direct support to the Director and faculty is minimum.

Recommendations:

1. That one additional faculty be added to support the workload of the faculty relative to continuing program and faculty development and evaluation, and to facilitate special projects. (LAC 46:XLVII.3515.A and B.6)
2. That tools be developed for the collection of data and that program records document the systematic analysis and use of data for program improvement. (LAC 46:XLVII.3523).

**Sanctioned** the application to establish a LPN to BSN program by the University of Phoenix College of Health Sciences and Nursing and authorize them to continue with Step II of the procedures for establishing a new program. Further, University of Phoenix is reminded that in accordance with §3533.2.c., public announcements of the opening of the proposed program and preadmission of students shall not occur prior to the receipt of initial Board approval.

**Accepted** the request of Charity/Delgado School of Nursing and Carol Leefe to accept her academic credentials for a faculty position according to LAC:XLVII.3515.B.4

**Accepted** the proposed clarification of definition of appropriate accrediting bodies as stated in §3503 (*Appropriate Accrediting Body* – the regional institutional accrediting agency for institutions of higher education (degree granting) recognized by the National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity, United State Department of Education), and (*National Nursing Accrediting Body* – the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission and the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education are recognized by the Board as appropriate national accrediting agencies for programs in nursing. For graduate nurse anesthesia programs, the recognized national accrediting body is the Council on Accreditation of Nurse Anesthesia Educational Programs.)

**Approved** the request of Northwestern Louisiana University and Debra Baggett to accept her academic credentials for a faculty position according to LAC: XLVII.3515.B.4.

**Approved** the request of Charity/Delgado School of Nursing and Alesia Thompson to accept her credentials for a faculty position according to LAC: XLVII.3515.B.4.

**Approved** the request of Dorothy A. Landry to recognize her academic credentials as meeting the qualifications to be a program head of an associate degree program as specified in LAC: XLVII.3515.B.3.

**Approved** the request of Pearl River Community College, ADN Program to utilize Washington St. Tammy Regional Medical Center, Northshore Regional Medical Center, and Slidell Memorial Hospital for clinical experiences January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2004.

**Approved** graduate programs in Louisiana preparing graduates for Advanced Practice Registered Nursing Licensure.

**MAJOR ACTIONS REGARDING NURSE PRACTICE MATTERS:**

**Adopted** the following nursing practice opinions:

**RN assisting and observing a physiologic cardiac stress test with or without a nuclear component in a clinic or outpatient setting:**

That the Board maintains that it is **not** within the scope of practice of a registered nurse to independently perform a cardiac stress test. However, it is within the scope of practice of a registered nurse to perform a physiologic cardiac stress test when the physician provides direct supervision as defined by the Medicare or Center of Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)\* and that the said registered nurse has the documented knowledge, skills, and abilities.

\*Direct Supervision in the office setting means the physician must be present in the office suite and immediately available to furnish assistance and direction throughout the performance of the procedure. It does not mean that the physician must be present in the room when the procedure is performed. Reference: Medicare Provider News – June 2001.

**RN initiating standing orders by physicians:**

**That the Board reconsider Nurse Practice Opinion 01.08 and reaffirm LAC 46:XLVII.3703.d that states *Executing Health Care Regimes as Prescribed by a Licensed Physician, Dentist, or Authorized Prescriber-carrying out the medical orders of a physician, dentist or authorized prescriber licensed in Louisiana. Registered Nurses may execute standing orders of an authorized prescriber provided the said prescriber initiates the standing orders and provided, further, that the said orders do not require the nurse to make a medical diagnosis or to engage in prescriptive activity.*** Further, the committee recommends that the medical staff in conjunction with nursing staff of each institution would determine how the order is initiated in each facility.

**Placing the cervical tenaculum and the uterine manipulator:** The Clinical Educator - Surgical Services, Woman's Hospital submitted a petition requesting an opinion regarding an RN in the perioperative arena placing the cervical tenaculum and the uterine manipulator to expedite the start of surgery if he/she has had training to do so.

That it is **not** within the scope of practice of a registered nurse to place the cervical tenaculum and uterine manipulator.

**Additional CPT Codes:**

That it is within the scope of practice of certified nurse practitioners to perform the following CPT codes:

- 82270 - Blood, occult, by peroxidase activity (e.g. guaiac), qualitative; feces, 1-3 simultaneous determinations
- 82947 - Glucose; quantitative, blood (except reagent strip)
- 86580 - Skin test; tuberculosis, intradermal
- 86585 - Skin test; tuberculosis, tine test
- 20610 - Arthrocentesis, aspiration and/or injection; major joint or bursa (e.g. shoulder, hip, knee joint, subacromial bursa).
- 95805 - Multiple sleep testing and interpretation of measurements

- 95810 - Sleep staging with 4 or more additional parameters of sleep, attended by a technologist
- 95811 - Sleep staging with 4 or more additional parameters of sleep, with initiation of continuous positive airway pressure therapy or bi-level ventilation, attended by a technologist
- 99221 Initial hospital care for the evaluation and management of a patient that requires medical decision making that is straightforward or of low complexity.
- 99222 Initial hospital care for the evaluation and management of a patient that requires medical decision making of moderate complexity.
- 99232 Subsequent hospital care for the evaluation and management of a patient that requires medical decision making of moderate complexity.
- 99243 Office consultation for a new or established patient that requires medical decision making of low complexity.
- 99244 Office consultation for a new or established patient that requires medical decision making of moderate complexity.
- 99251 Initial inpatient consultation for a new or established patient that requires straightforward medical decision making.
- 99252 Initial inpatient consultant for a new or established patient that requires straightforward medical decision making.
- 99253 Initial inpatient consultation for a new or established patient that requires medical decision making of low complexity.
- 99254 Initial inpatient consultation for a new or established patient that requires medical decision making of moderate complexity.
- 99261 Follow-up inpatient consultation for an established patient that requires medical decision making that is straightforward or of low complexity.
- 99262 Follow-up inpatient consultation for an established patient that requires medical decision making of moderate complexity.
- 93015 Cardiovascular stress test using maximal or sub-maximal treadmill or bicycle exercise, continuous electrocardiographic monitoring, and/or pharmacological stress, with physician supervision, with interpretation and report.
- 96115 Neurobehavioral status exam (clinical assessment of thinking, reasoning and judgment, e.g., acquired knowledge, attention, memory, visual spatial abilities, language functions, planning) with interpretation and report, per hour.
- 81001 Urinalysis automated, with microscopy.
- 87149 Microbiology identification by nucleic acid probe.
- 87480 Microbiology Candida species, direct probe technique.
- 87490 Microbiology Chlamydia trachomatis, direct probe technique.
- 87510 Microbiology Gardnerella vaginalis, direct probe technique.
- 87590 Microbiology Neisseria gonorrhea, direct probe technique.
- 87797 Microbiology Infectious agent detection by nucleic acid (DNA or RNA), not otherwise specified; direct probe technique, each organism.

In order for a CNP to perform Board approved procedures as designated by the specific CPT codes it must be within that said APRN's area of specialization and consistent with the APRN's collaborative practice agreement with the collaborative practice physician(s).

That it is within the scope of practice of women's health nurse practitioners to perform the following CPT codes:

- 76810 - Ultrasound, pregnant uterus, B-scan and/or real time with image documentation; complete (complete fetal and maternal evaluation), multiple gestation, after the first trimester
- 82270 - Blood, occult, by peroxidase activity (e.g. guaiac), qualitative; feces, 1-3 simultaneous determinations

**RN draining a pleural catheter:** The Nursing Education Coordinator, Opelousas General Hospital submitted a petition requesting an opinion regarding an RN draining a (Pleurx) pleural catheter in the home health and acute care settings.

That it is within the scope of practice of a registered nurse to drain a pleural catheter which is inserted into the intrapleural space to drain excess fluid from the pleural cavity in the acute care and home health settings provided the said RN has the documented knowledge, skills, and abilities and the institution has a written policy in place to provide for such.

**Providing anesthesia services for a podiatrist:** The Department Manager, Lady of the Sea Hospital submitted a petition requesting an opinion regarding a CRNA in solo practice (no anesthesiologist) providing anesthesia for a podiatrist in surgery.

That it is not within the scope of practice of a CRNA to provide anesthesia services for a podiatrist.

**RN administering analgesic agents for pain management:** The Special Projects Officer, LSUHSC-UMC, Lafayette submitted a petition requesting an opinion regarding an RN providing care for patients receiving analgesia by epidural catheter or infusion device of opioids, steroids, alpha-agonists, or other medications including combinations.

That it is within the scope of practice of a registered nurse to replace empty syringes and/or infusion bag of analgesic pre-prepared solutions and to adjust the infusion rate and/or the administration of an additional dose of analgesia according to the institution's pain intensity level protocol and the Board's previous opinions regarding the epidural administration of analgesic agents and pain management.

**RN in the emergency room completing the *Medical Screening Exam*:** The Nurse Manager, Ville Platte Medical Center submitted a petition requesting an opinion regarding an RN in the emergency room completing the *Medical Screening Exam* (MSE) if they are trained as a *Qualified Medical Personnel* (QMP) to determine if an *emergency medical condition* (EMC) does or does not exist.

That it is not within the authorized scope of practice for a registered nurse to perform an appropriate medical screening exam (MSE) for the purpose of determining if an emergency medical condition (EMC) exists; the Board reaffirms its previous opinion (96.18) that it is within the scope of practice for a registered nurse qualified in emergency care with documented knowledge, skills, and abilities to triage (assess the health status of an individual to determine a non-emergent status and to formulate nursing diagnosis based on health care needs to serve as the basis for indicating nursing care or for which referral to appropriate medical or community resources for the non-emergent health status) provided that triage guidelines are in place to assist the registered nurse with appropriate referrals approved by the agency's emergency medical director. Furthermore, it is within the scope of practice for an advanced practice registered to perform an appropriate medical screening exam (MSE) for the purpose of determining if an emergency medical condition (EMC) exists in accordance with the Law (R.S. 37:913.(3)(b)(i)(ii) & R.S. 37:913.(8) & (9).

**REPORT ON THE JOINT ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE RELATIVE  
TO LIMITED PRESCRIPTIVE AND DISTRIBUTING AUTHORITY FOR  
ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES**

The Joint Administration Committee (JAC) for Limited Prescriptive and Distributing Authority for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) is composed of ten members: five members designated by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) and five members designated by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners (LSBME) as follows: one APRN practicing in a rural area, appointed by LSBN from a list submitted by the Louisiana Association of Nurse Practitioners; one APRN practicing in an urban area appointed by the LSBN from a list submitted by Louisiana State Nurses Association; three registered nurses on the LSBN Board appointed by the Board; two physicians on the LSBME appointed by that Board; one physician that collaborates with an APRN practicing in a rural area appointed by the LSBME from a list submitted by the Louisiana State Medical Society; one physician that collaborates with an APRN practicing in an urban area appointed by the LSBME from a list submitted by the Louisiana State Medical Society; one physician that collaborates with an APRN appointed by the LSBME from a list submitted by the Louisiana Medical Association.

In accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.4513.C, the JAC is responsible for the review of the application and renewal and all related materials, and approves, modifies, or denies the application.

The following table reflects the number of APRNs with Limited Prescriptive and Distributing Authority in compliance with the Board's rules on **January 31, 2003**.

## SUMMARY REPORT OF NURSING COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES - 2002

In 2002, during four (4) scheduled formal disciplinary hearings, the Board heard 271 disciplinary cases within eight (8) days of closed Board hearings. These cases involved: formal complaints against licensees, applicants or students; reinstatement requests from licensees with suspended licenses; consent agreements; ratification of staff actions for automatic suspensions or denials of licensure, and review of Settlement Orders.

During 2002, the disciplinary section received 429 complaints against registered nurses, registered nurse applicants, or students requiring preliminary investigation. Not counted as complaints are anonymous letters and telephone calls received each month which involve disciplinary matters, but which fail to produce sufficient evidence to begin an investigation.

The types of complaints received during 2002 against nurses or applicants were:

After investigating the various complaints and based on the information received, the Board of Nursing issued two hundred thirty-one (231) official charges, Show Cause Orders, or notice of complaints. After hearing the charges or accepting a total of one hundred forty-five (145) Consent Orders, and sixteen (16) Settlement Orders, the Board suspended a total of twenty-six (26) licenses, and additionally ratified forty-eight (48) automatic suspensions issued by staff. Two (2) licenses were summarily suspended, and seventeen (17) licenses were voluntarily surrendered. Two (2) licenses were revoked. Nineteen (19) licenses were suspended with stay, or retained with stipulations or probations, and forty-nine (49) licensees were reprimanded.

A total of twenty (20) individuals requested reinstatement of suspended licenses. Of these, nineteen (19) licenses were reinstated.

This year, fifty-six (56) students or applicants for NCLEX-RN came before the Board, primarily to respond to prior criminal convictions. Of this number, twenty-eight (28) students were granted approval to continue in clinical nursing courses, and fourteen (14) students were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met. Thirteen (13) student applicants were granted approval for NCLEX-RN or licensure, and two (2) applicants were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met.

477 investigations were resolved.

**SUMMARY REPORT ON RENEWAL  
OF LICENSEE WITH DEFAULTED STUDENT LOANS**

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing withheld the 2003 licensure renewal applications of thirty-nine (39) registered nurses who were deemed by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) to be in default of a student loan.

On August 29, 2002, certified letters were mailed notifying these registered nurses that their 2003 renewal application would be withheld until the Board received notification from LOSFA that payment arrangements had been made. As of January 31, 2003, thirty (30) of the thirty-nine (39) individuals had complied with LOSFA and were issued renewal applications. The remaining nine (9) registered nurses did not comply, were placed on a delinquent licensure status and were not able to practice nursing in Louisiana.

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**SUMMARY REPORT ON RELICENSURE AUDIT**

The Continuing Education Audit for compliance in 2002 is in progress. One Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Eight (1,158) RNs were randomly selected and notifications were sent in February 2003. As of June 2, 2003, One Thousand One Hundred Forty-Two (1,142) or 98% of the total population have verified compliance.

Licensees who have not satisfactorily met the audit or falsified the licensure renewal application are subject to have their licenses invalidated and disciplinary action imposed.

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2002, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) was administered to **1890** candidates for licensure by examination using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). Of this number **1648** individuals were licensed. There were **1431** graduates from **22** nursing programs in Louisiana who tested for the first time during 2002. Of this number, **1292** were licensed; thereby, achieving a ninety percent (90.3%) pass rate for the first time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana. This is above the national average of eighty-six percent (86.7%).

**INDIVIDUALS REVIEWED BY THE BOARD DUE TO CRIMINAL ARREST/CHARGES, ADDICTION, IMPAIRMENT OR PRIOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

**GRADUATES:**

There were **195** candidates testing who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, and/or disciplinary action by another Board.

There were **2,122** criminal record checks processed by finger print cards on applicants for licensure by examination.

**STUDENTS:**

There were **227** students requesting approval from the Board to enter or continue in clinical nursing courses, who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, or disciplinary action by another Board.
