

INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, for the year beginning January 1, 2003 and ending December 31, 2003, has been prepared in accord with L.R.S. 37:911 et seq., particularly L.R.S. 37:918.10, which provides that the Board shall "publish an annual report for distribution to the Governor and Legislature."

During 2003, the Board of Nursing met a total of fourteen (14) days in Board meetings, including four (4) days of open business sessions, eight (8) days of closed disciplinary sessions, two (2) days of special call meetings. In addition, the Board met a total of ten (10) days in committee meetings and (13) days in subcommittees, including four (4) Administrative Committee meetings, five (5) Credentialing Committee meetings, four (4) Education Committee meetings, three (3) Compliance Committee meetings, four (4) Practice Committee meetings, (2) Joint Administrative Committee meetings, two (2) Advisory Council meetings, five (5) Practice Committee Task Force on Pain Management. Members of the Board met a total of six (6) days for Disciplinary Settlement Hearings. The actions taken at these meetings are reported among the activities of the Board.

Board representatives staffed six (6) Nursing Supply and Demand Commission meetings and two (2) Nursing Supply and Demand Subcommittee meetings. The subcommittees included one on the implementation of Senate Concurrent Resolution 140 and the other on qualifications of nurse faculty. The Board President served as a member of the Louisiana Health Works Commission.

In addition to the activities of the Board, the Report presents the current organization of the Board of Nursing, as well as the goals and objectives of the Board and the significant activities of the Board's professional staff. Statistical data depicting the current status of the Board-approved nursing education programs are presented in tabulated form for each reference. Also depicted in the statistical data are characteristics of the licensee population.

The intent of the 2003 Annual Report is to document objective data that can be used in planning and decision-making relative to nursing.

MISSION STATEMENT

To safeguard the life and health of the citizens of Louisiana by assuring persons practicing as registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses are competent and safe.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal I: Promote regulatory effectiveness.

Objectives:

- 1. Identify performance indicators for each major function, incorporating national benchmarking: licensing (RN & APRN); approval of educational programs; practice standards; compliance processes; and Recovery Nurse Program.
- 2. Develop and implement tools for measuring performance and continuous quality improvement.
- 3. Evaluate the regulatory effectiveness of jurisdiction over student nurses.
- 4. Develop system for criminal background checks on all applicants for clinical nursing courses.
- 5. Develop processes for verifying standards in Chapter 45 for programs preparing graduates for APRN licensure.
- 6. Use survey results from National Council State Boards of Nursing Excellence Project to improve services.

Goal II: Assure efficient and timely responses to nursing issues affecting patient safety.

- 1. Fully implement and evaluate priority system.
- 2. Develop and implement tools to facilitate investigative process.
- 3. Revise disciplinary section guidelines.
- 4. Revise policy regarding delay/denial of licensure.
- 5. Evaluate the regional system.

Goal III: Enhance image and visibility of the Board.

- 1. Provide presentations to undergraduate and graduate students in nursing programs.
- 2. Complete needs assessment to determine learning needs/interest of licensees as related to Board functions.
- 3. Conduct educational programs regionally to meet learning needs/interests of licenses as identified above.
- 4. Identify and enhance new means of communication/information sharing in addition to the Examiner.
- 5. Participate in liaison activities with other interested groups.
- 6. Initiate program to improve the communication/customer service of all office staff with the public.

Goal IV: Identify and regulate evolving role of the registered nurse and advanced practice registered nurse as a professional while protecting the public.

- 1. Complete the credentialing standards and promulgation of the rules for controlled substances for APRNs.
- 2. Evaluate the emerging roles of APRNs.
- 3. Explore the differentiation of nursing roles in accordance with educational preparation.
- 4. Identify critical patient safety issues related to the accessibility of properly prepared registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses and work collectively with nursing organizations, healthcare providers and other regulatory agencies to resolve.
- 5. Identify, analyze, and disseminate ongoing changes to RN scope of practice to consumers.

Goal V: Facilitate board and staff development.

- 1. Develop a self-assessment process for board members and staff.
- 2. Support the continuous development of board and staff.
- 3. Support and embrace the strategic plan.
- 4. Evaluate orientation plan for new board members.
- 5. Establish mechanisms for improving internal communications.

Further, that the issue be forwarded to the Education Committee to review the rules and make revisions as necessary to assure that the education of Louisiana students be a priority.

Approved the request of Kathleen Wren, LSUHSC Anesthesia Program, to recognize the credentials of Ronald E. Smith as eligible for faculty appointment in accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.4509.A.1.f.i.-iv.

Approved the plan submitted by Grambling in response to the performance of their graduates on the NCLEX-RN in 2002 and that they submit an analysis of the effect of their actions on the performance of their graduates in one calendar year.

Approved the request from Our Lady of the Lake for an accelerated program to be conducted in the New Orleans area in collaboration with Tulane University Hospital pending verification to Board staff of qualified nursing facility and documented proof of contact with other programs to coordinate use of clinical facilities.

Accepted the report of LSBN/CCNE coordinated site-visit to Northwestern State University, and;

Approved the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program at Northwestern State University with one suggestion as follows:

<u>Suggestion</u>: Consistent with declining NCLEX-RN pass rates and in light of the recent evaluation activities instituted, that data continue to be collected, analyzed and used to improve all aspects of the program (LAC 46:XLVII.3523).

Approved the Master of Science in Nursing program at Northwestern State University be granted full continuing approval with one suggestion as follows:

Suggestion: Increase the number of doctorate prepared faculty consistent with the University requirements for full graduate faculty status and to support increased scholarly productivity consistent with masters level education (LAC 46:XLVII.4509.1.f).

Approved the request of Texas Wesleylan for clinical practicum of their anesthesia students in Louisiana and to clarify the role of the Board with regards to out-of-state students in clinical facilities needed by students in Louisiana graduate programs.

Approved request from Louisiana State University Health Science Center Anesthesia Program to review the rules in Chapter 35 and Chapter 45 to provide clarification of the Board's role on the issue of out-of-state graduate students in Louisiana health care facilities.

In order for a CNP to perform Board approved procedures as designated by the specific CPT codes it must be within that said APRN's area of specialization and consistent with the APRN's collaborative practice agreement with the collaborative practice physician(s).

RN delegating to an LPN the injection of local anesthetic agents: The Director of the Breast Center, Our Lady of Lourdes submitted a request for an opinion regarding an RN delegating to an LPN the injection of local anesthetic agents at the IV site prior to starting an IV to provide patient comfort.

That the exception in RS 37:930(D), which permits registered nurses who are not certified nurse anesthetists, to administer local anesthetic agents by injection under the skin does not include language indicating that this function can be delegated; therefore, an RN cannot delegate to an LPN the injection of local anesthetic agents.

Furthermore, that this issue be referred to a task force to be established regarding RS 37:930.

RN delegating PRN medications to trained unlicensed school employees:

That it is within the scope of practice for school nurses, based on their assessment and in collaboration with the child's physician and parents, when a characteristic set of symptoms occur for a specific student that the school nurse may delegate to trained unlicensed school personnel the prescribed PRN metered dose inhalant for students with asthma.

RNs administering analgesic doses of anesthetic agent:

To seek legal advice from the Board's attorney regarding RS 37:930 as it relates to RNs administering analgesic doses of anesthetic agents, to establish a task force to study the RNs scope of practice as it relates to pain management and to table this agenda item until the task force makes their recommendation to the Committee.

RN removing an internal vascular doppler:

That it is not within the scope of practice for an RN to remove an internal vascular flow Doppler that is implanted, cuffed, sutured or non-sutured.

RN accessing a life-port in the subcutaneous area of the abdomen for recurrent ascites:

That it is within the scope of practice for an RN to access a life-port in the subcutaneous area of the abdomen to remove recurrent ascites in accordance with a medical order provided that the said RN has documented knowledge, skills, and abilities.

RN monitoring a patient receiving deep sedation:

That the Board defer action until the task force convenes and makes recommendations to the Committee regarding section RS 37:930.

RN injecting contrast media intra-arterially during diagnostic cardiac cath procedures:

That it is within the scope of practice for registered nurses to administer intra-arterially contrast media for cardiac cath procedures provided the said RN has the documented knowledge, skills and abilities.

After due deliberation, the Board **adopted** the following nursing practice opinions:

RN's scope of practice to delegate to unlicensed nursing personnel a bowel dis-impaction in the home health setting - That it is not within the scope of practice for a Registered Nurse to delegate to unlicensed nursing personnel a bowel dis-impaction in the home health setting.

After due deliberation of the following nursing practice opinions the Board made the following actions:

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for CNP and CNS to perform CPT codes 99291 and 99292.

Approved that is within the scope of practice for CNM, WHNP and FNP to perform CPT codes J7300, J7302, 11981, 99234, 99235, and 99236.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice of RNs to delegate to trained unlicensed school personnel the administration of medication through a gastrostomy tube in a school setting.

Approved the following opinion request to be referred to the Task Force on Pain Management: Opinion regarding RN administering a bolus dose of bupivacaine and sufenta via pump using preestablished parameters for pain management during labor.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for an RN to practice under the SANE program provided the RN has documentation of knowledge, skills, and abilities as set forth in the clinical forensic course recognized by ANCC and that the SANE RN shall practice within the scope and standards of forensic nursing practice as developed by the International Association of Forensic Nurses and published by the American Nurses Association. Nothing herein shall include medical diagnosis and the RN may not perform the bimanual examination of pelvic organs.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for the CNP and CNS to perform CPT codes 17000 and 56420.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for RNs to remove PICC lines in acute care setting provided the RN has relevant knowledge, skills, and abilities.

Accepted the proposed scope of practice of decision trees for publication on the Board's website.

After due deliberation of the following nursing practice opinions the Board made the following actions:

Reaffirmed the Board's previous opinion regarding microdermabrasion Nurse Practice Opinion 01.12.

Adopted that it is **not** within the scope of practice for an RN to delegate to an LPN the reinsertion of a gastrostomy tube into an old stoma.

Adopted that it is within the scope of practice for the RN to delegate to the LPN the accessing and terminating of double-lumen permacaths and central line catheters used for hemodialysis in the outpatient /chronic setting. Furthermore, the Declaratory Statement will be expanded to provide for education/training specifications of the LPN to access/terminate these devices and the role of the RN assessing the patient prior to delegation; and, furthermore staff will incorporate in the Declaratory Statement the revision date. (See attached.) Also, accepted the recommendation that the Board provide a definition that will clarify the terms that are used in the Declaratory Statement as it relates to "supervised," "immediately available," and "immediate supervision."

Adopted that it is within the scope of practice for the RN, under the direction of a licensed physician or other authorized prescriber to perform the medical evaluation to fit a respirator device according to OSHA requirements; furthermore, it is within the scope of practice of APRNs to perform this evaluation.

SUMMARY REPORT OF NURSING COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES - 2003

In 2003, during four (4) scheduled formal disciplinary hearings, the Board heard 351 disciplinary cases within eight (8) days of closed Board hearings. These cases involved: formal complaints against licensees, applicants or students; reinstatement requests from licensees with suspended licenses; consent agreements; ratification of staff actions for automatic suspensions or denials of licensure, and review of Settlement Orders.

During 2003, the disciplinary section received 590 complaints against registered nurses, registered nurse applicants, or students requiring preliminary investigation. Not counted as complaints are anonymous letters and telephone calls received each month which involve disciplinary matters, but which fail to produce sufficient evidence to begin an investigation.

After investigating the various complaints and based on the information received, the Board of Nursing issued two hundred fifty-seven (257) official charges, Show Cause Orders, or notice of complaints. After hearing the charges or accepting a total of one hundred ninety-five (195) Consent Orders, and eleven (11) Settlement Orders, the Board suspended a total of thirty-four (34) licenses, and additionally ratified seventy-two (72) automatic suspensions issued by staff. Ten (10) licenses were summarily suspended, and fifteen (15) licenses were voluntarily surrendered. One (1) license was revoked. Fifty-six (56) licenses were suspended with stay, or retained with stipulations or probations, and fifty-seven (57) licensees were reprimanded.

A total of twenty-one (21) individuals requested reinstatement of suspended licenses. Of these, twenty-one (21) licenses were reinstated.

This year, seventy-nine (79) students or applicants for NCLEX-RN came before the Board, primarily to respond to prior criminal convictions. Of this number, twenty-six (26) students were granted approval to continue in clinical nursing courses, and thirty (30) students were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met. Seventeen (17) student applicants were granted approval for NCLEX-RN or licensure, and six (6) applicants were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met.

753 investigations were resolved.

SUMMARY REPORT ON RENEWAL OF LICENSEES WITH DEFAULTED STUDENT LOANS

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing withheld the 2004 licensure renewal applications of thirty-two (32) registered nurses who were deemed by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) to be in default of a student loan.

On August 22, 2003, certified letters were mailed notifying these registered nurses that their 2004 renewal application would be withheld until the Board received notification from LOSFA that payment arrangements had been made. As of January 31, 2004, twenty-five (25) of the thirty-two (32) individuals had complied with LOSFA and were issued renewal applications. The remaining seven (7) registered nurses did not comply, were placed on a delinquent licensure status and were not able to practice nursing in Louisiana.

SUMMARY REPORT ON RELICENSURE AUDIT

The Continuing Education Audit for compliance in 2003 is in progress. One thousand one hundred eighty-three (1,183) RNs were randomly selected and notifications were sent in March 2004. May 3, 2004 was the deadline for responses. As of May 12, 2004, 1000 or 85% of the total population have verified compliance.

Licensees who have not satisfactorily met the audit or falsified the licensure renewal application are subject to have their licenses invalidated and disciplinary action imposed.

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2003, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) was administered to <u>1766</u> candidates for licensure by examination using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). Of this number <u>1461</u> individuals were licensed. There were <u>1347</u> graduates from <u>21</u> nursing programs in Louisiana who tested for the first time during 2003. Of this number, <u>1213</u> were licensed; thereby, achieving a ninety percent (90.1%) pass rate for first time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana. This is above the national average of eighty-seven percent (87%).

INDIVIDUALS REVIEWED BY THE BOARD DUE TO CRIMINAL ARREST/CHARGES, ADDICTION, IMPAIRMENT OR PRIOR DISCIPINARY ACTION

GRADUATES:

There were <u>197</u> candidates testing who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, and/or disciplinary action by another Board.

There were <u>1,573</u> criminal record checks processed by finger print cards on applicants for licensure by examination.

STUDENTS:

There were <u>448</u> students requesting approval from the Board to enter or continue in clinical nursing courses, who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addition, physical or mental impairment, or disciplinary action by another Board.
