

Approved the recommendation that Grambling State University be required to provide continuing progress reports relative to plans initiated and other efforts made by the institution to increase the success rates of its graduates taking the NCLEX-RN for presentation at each regularly scheduled meeting of the Education Committee of the LSBN

Approved the recommendation that LSBN provide continuing support to Grambling State University’s efforts to increase the success rates of its graduates taking the NCLEX-RN to the extent allowed by law and in consideration of the resources available

Approved the recommendation that Grambling State University be placed on notice that if the NCLEX-RN passage rates of its graduates continue to not meet the established standards upon receipt and after review of the 2008 results, the LSBN will have no option other than to enforce the provisions of LAC 46:XLVII.3535 which provide, in pertinent part, for the suspension of the institution’s ability to admit new students to its program until such time as the Board has determined that all applicable standards have been met

Approved the recommendation to commend Ochsner Medical Center and Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center for developing a research project that is aimed at alleviating RN workforce issues and that the Louisiana State Board of Nursing would like to be updated on the obstacles or barriers to this process

The LSBN Board and staff continued their efforts to meet the strategic initiatives in the 2007-2010 Strategic Plan. LRS:37:911 finds that the practice of nursing by qualified individuals is necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Louisiana. In order to promote, preserve, and protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the LSBN is charged with the regulation of nursing education and practice and ensuring that any individual practicing or offering to practice nursing or using the title “registered nurse” or “advanced practice registered nurse” shall be licensed to do so.

DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE LSBN

The duties and powers of the LSBN are defined in RS37:918. In order to assure that individuals licensed to practice as registered nurses and/or advanced practice registered nurses are qualified, the LSBN is empowered to regulate nursing education and practice in Louisiana. Further, the LSBN is charged with the responsibility to deny, revoke, suspend, probate, limit or otherwise discipline individuals who violate the provisions of the law governing nursing practice in Louisiana. The following sections reflect information regarding activities of the LSBN in safeguarding the citizens of Louisiana in major areas: Nursing Education, Licensure, and Discipline/Alternative to Discipline.

NURSING EDUCATION

Registered Nurse Education

The LSBN approved twenty-five (25) programs of nursing preparing individuals for licensure as registered nurses, one (1) diploma program, eleven (11) associate degree programs, and thirteen (13) baccalaureate programs. In 2008, these approved programs graduated a total of two thousand, two hundred and eleven (2211) individuals prepared to become licensed as registered nurses. Table 2 reflects the number of graduates for each program in the past four years and as projected for 2009. This reflects a graduation growth rate of 23% since 2005.

Louisiana programs of nursing have continued to increase the numbers of admissions to respond for the growing demand. In 2008, programs admitted three thousand six hundred and seven (3607) individuals into clinical nursing sequence. This represents a 19% growth since 2005. During the same period, the numbers of qualified applicants also continued to increase to a high of five thousand and two hundred and ninety seven applicants (5,297), a 22% increase in the applicant pool. Table 3 reflects the number of qualified applicants and admissions for each program in the past four years. Table 4 demonstrates the total from all nursing programs of the numbers of applicants, admissions, enrollment in clinical nursing courses, nursing majors, qualified applicants not admitted, and graduations. Table 5 reflects the rating of factors for each program affecting the ability to admit additional qualified applicants.

Nursing programs reported that the student population was comprised of 86.3% females and 13.7% males. Table 6 reflects the student population by gender for each program. Table 7 reflects the ethnicity of the current student population for each program with 70.4% of the student population reported as White, and 22.4% reported Black, with Asian, Hispanic or Other comprising the remaining 7.2% percent. This reflects a decrease in minority student enrollment since 2005 which reflected 65% White, 30% Black with Asian, Hispanic or Other comprising the remaining 5%.

The Louisiana Nursing Articulation Model was revised in 2005 to assure that Louisiana programs were providing opportunities for articulation. Table 8 reflects the numbers of non-generic graduates of nursing programs in Louisiana from 2007-2008 academic year. Table 9 reflects data on the education status of students enrolled in clinical nursing courses as of October 15, 2008. Table 10 reflects the education status of students enrolled in Nursing Education Programs in Louisiana 2002-2007 academic years.

Nurse Faculty

Educational capacity is directly related to the number of qualified faculty. Table 11 reflects the number of budgeted nurse faculty positions and total employed faculty on a full-time or part-time basis for each program. Table 12 reflects the total individual faculty by highest credential earned for academic report year 2007-2008. This data

reflects that 93.1% of the faculty is prepared at the minimum level of a Masters in Nursing and 7.5% of the faculty were below that minimum level and were approved by exception. Table 13 reflects the academic credentials of Nurse Faculty over a ten (10) year period. The percentage of nurse faculty prepared below the minimum requirements has grown from 2.9% in 1998 to a high of 7.5% in 2008. Table 14 reflects the faculty age for each program and reflects the numbers of faculty retirements that can be projected in the next few years. Fifty-one percent (51%) of the faculty population are over age 50 and fifteen percent (15%) are over 60 years of age.

NCLEX-RN

Louisiana graduates taking the NCLEX-RN licensure examination for the first time in the calendar year of January 1 to December 31, 2008 experienced a 90.21% pass rate. This compares with a national pass rate of 86.73%. Table 15 reflects the performance of first time candidates by nursing education program. Table 16 reflects the performance of all candidates taking the NCLEX-RN licensure examination during 2008.

Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Education

The LSBN approved six (6) schools and one (1) intercollegiate consortium comprised of three(3) schools of nursing to offer programs of studies preparing individuals for advanced practice registered nursing in the nurse practitioner (NP), clinical nurse specialist (CNS) and certified registered nurse anesthetist (CRNA) categories. There are no schools in Louisiana currently approved to prepared certified nurse midwives (CNM). Table 17 reflects the roles and specialty categories of advanced practice registered nurse programs offered by Louisiana programs. Table 18 reflects the enrollment and graduation by program for 2005-2008.

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2008, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) was administered to 2,562 candidates for licensure by examination using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). Of this number 2,228 individuals were licensed. There were 2,023 graduates from 23 nursing programs in Louisiana who tested for the first time during 2008. Of this number, 1,825 were licensed; thereby, achieving a 90.21 percent pass rate for first time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana. This is above the national average of 86.73 percent.

LICENSURE

Applications to enroll in clinical nursing courses

There were three thousand two hundred and thirty four (3234) applications to enroll in clinical nursing courses in calendar year 2008. Of these five hundred and forty five (545) were placed under investigation for information disclosed which may reflect on the ability to practice nursing safely. A total of three thousand, six hundred and forty-five (3645) student applications were approved for clinical enrollment, eleven (11) were delayed approval and fourteen (14) denied.

Registered Nurse Licensure

A total of forty-six thousand seven hundred and eighty-three (46,783) registered nurses(RN) and two thousand eight hundred and twenty-five (2825) advanced practice registered nurses (APRN) renewed their licenses to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana by the January 31, 2008 due date. A total of two thousand eight hundred and forty-nine (2849) individuals relinquished the right to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana, three hundred and fifty-one (351) RNs requested inactive status, two thousand four hundred and twenty-eight (2428) RNs failed to renew, and seventy (70) requested retired status. The LSBN additionally licensed (2,228) individuals to practice as registered nurses as initial licensure by examination and one thousand four hundred and eighty-one (1481) individuals to practice as registered nurse by endorsement. One Thousand (1000) individuals reinstated their privilege to practice nursing in Louisiana.

Table 19 reflects the number of applications processed for licensure by endorsement, permits issued and individuals completing the application process for licensure over the years of 2004-2008.

Verification of Credentials To Other States

In 2008, a total of two thousand six hundred and fifty-nine (2659) registered nurses requested their credentials be verified to other state boards of nursing. Data is not sufficient to determine the real impact of this number to the workforce in Louisiana. Individuals requesting verification may or may not be currently practicing in Louisiana. Numbers of verification request can be impacted by unknown variables. Empirically the numbers of verifications increased following Hurricane Katrina and with an RN strike in another state; however, the real impact to the overall nursing workforce can not be determined without the ability to more closely examine the overall nurse population. Table 20 reflects the number of individuals requesting licensure verifications over the years of 2004-2008.

RN Population During 2008

A total of fifty-two thousand and fifty-two (52,052) individuals held a license to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana at least sometime during 2008. Forty-four thousand seven hundred (44,700) of these individuals resided in Louisiana and seven thousand three hundred and forty-four (7,344) resided out of state. The total number of licenses residing in Louisiana in 2008 represents a 2.6% increase over those licensed and residing in Louisiana in 2007. The LSBN collects demographic information regarding the nursing workforce as a component of the licensure renewal process. Tables 21 to 29 summarize information collected and reported on the RN population for the years 2004-2008. Appendices D contains the 2008 raw data responses by licensees by Louisiana parishes.

Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

The LSBN authorizes the practice of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) in four categories, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA), Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM), Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), and Nurse Practitioner (NP). In 2008, a total of three thousand and four hundred and five (3495) individuals were licensed to practice as APRNs, one thousand and seven hundred and thirty four (1734) were licensed as NPs, one thousand and three hundred and twenty-seven (1327) as CRNAs, three hundred and six (306) CNSs and thirty-eight (38) CNMs.

During 2008, the LSBN received a total of three hundred and thirty-one (331) applications for APRN licensure, two hundred and seventy-two (270) by examination, fifty-seven (57) by endorsement from another state and two (2) listed as "other".

Table 30 reflects the number of individuals reporting employment in one of these four categories during 2008. Table 31 reflects the number of APRNs with prescriptive authority by Louisiana parish of residence.

RENEWAL OF LICENSEES WITH DEFAULTED STUDENT LOANS

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing withheld the 2009 licensure renewals on fifty-two (52) registered nurses who were deemed by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) to be in default of a student loan.

Certified letters were mailed notifying these registered nurses that their 2009 renewal could not be processed until the Board received notification from LOSFA that payment arrangements had been made. As of February 2, 2009, forty-two (42) of the fifty-two (52) individuals had complied with LOSFA and were permitted to seek licensure renewal. Of the remaining ten (10) nurses, one (1) had her license suspended for non-compliance, two (2) contacted the Board and choose to place their license on inactive status, and the remaining seven (7) were placed on a delinquent licensure status and were not able to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana.

RELICENSURE AUDIT

In accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.3335.I.2, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing performed an audit on the continuing educational requirements for 2008 license renewal on one-thousand two-hundred fifty-eight (1,258) registered nurses.

Letters were mailed to these nurses advising that they had been selected for the random audit. Of the one-thousand-two-hundred-fifty-eight (1,258) registered nurses selected, one-thousand-one-hundred-forty-three (1,143) were compliant. One-hundred-fifteen (115) nurses were non-compliant with the following breakdown:

- Eighty-five (85) were issued Informal Reprimands for 1st time non-compliance with the CE audit
- Twenty-eight (28) provided written explanation for cause in not meeting audit
- One (1) was deceased
- One (1) was retired

In accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.4513.D.5, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing performed an audit on the continuing competency for prescriptive authority for 2009 license renewal on thirty-three (33) advanced practice nurses. Letters were mailed to these nurses advising they had been selected to audit the additional hours of pharmacology needed for their prescriptive authority privileges. Of the thirty-three (33) selected, thirty (30) were compliant and three (3) were issued Informal Reprimands for 1st time non-compliance.

DISCIPLINARY/ALTERNATIVE TO DISCIPLINE

INVESTIGATIONS

During the calendar year of January 1, 2008 – December 31, 2008, a total of one thousand six hundred and four (1,604) complaints against registered nurses, registered nurse applicants, or individuals requesting enrollment in clinical nursing courses were placed under investigation by LSBN. Most of the above complaints involve the self-report of individuals regarding criminal incidents and/or mental or physical ability to practice nursing, five hundred and forty-five (545) individuals applying to enter clinical nursing courses, twenty-three (23) applying for licensure by endorsement, and five (5) individuals applying for licensure by examination. In 2008, nine hundred and eighty-six (986) individuals licensed as registered nurses and thirty-nine (39) individuals licensed as advanced practice registered nurses were placed under investigation by the LSBN. The remaining six (6) complaints represent individuals found not to be registered nurses or advanced practice registered nurses.

The types of complaints received during 2008 against nurses, applicants for licensure or students enrolling in clinical nursing courses were:

In 2008, LSBN closed a total of one thousand four hundred and eighteen investigations (1418). As of December 31, 2008, the LSBN has seven hundred and fifty nine (759) cases pending investigation.

MONITORING

As of December 31, 2008, the LSBN monitored five hundred and fifty-nine (559) individuals with encumbered/restricted licenses, three hundred and forty-four (344) through disciplinary order and two hundred and fifteen (215) under program agreement with the Recovering Nurse Program (RNP). A total of three hundred and sixty-nine (369) individuals were under contract with the RNP.

During 2008, one hundred and ninety-four (194) individuals were reported to the RNP, of these one hundred and twenty-five (125) entered the program and sixty-nine (69) refused. In addition thirty-eight (38) individuals reentered the RNP in order to document compliance prior to requesting relicensure.

Fifty-five (55) individuals completed all RNP requirements successfully and were released. Twenty-nine (29) were released from the RNP as non-compliant. Individuals non-compliant with the RNP are subject to automatic suspension of licensure.

During 2008, sixty-two (62) registered nurses and eight (8) students enrolled in clinical nursing courses had their licenses/ approval suspended due to non-compliance with a LSBN order or violation of a RNP contract.

APPENDIX C

NURSING EDUCATION ARTICULATION IN LOUISIANA

The Louisiana Nursing Articulation Model was developed in 2005 to assure that Louisiana programs in nursing were providing opportunities for articulation for the Louisiana nurse population. The model has been adopted by both regulatory boards of nursing and is in place in all programs preparing for RN licensure. In 2006, there were five hundred eighty-four (584) licensed practical nurses enrolled in programs preparing for RN licensure and there were two hundred forty (240) RNs enrolled who were seeking baccalaureate degrees.

The model is comprehensive and is consistent with trends throughout the United States. The model is as follows:

Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model

Overview:

Through Act 818 of the 1991 Louisiana Legislature, the Nursing Supply and Demand Commission (NSDC) was established and charged, in part, with the responsibility of developing an articulation model that was organized and integrated in such a fashion to permit the maximum amount of prior training to be credited against the requirements of any subsequent nursing education program(s). This plan was to include nursing assistant through the baccalaureate degree in nursing. To this end, the NSDC adopted an articulation model in 1993 entitled Articulation Plan for Nursing in Louisiana and presented the report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Health and Welfare on April 6, 1993. Through this legislation, the nursing boards were charged with review of standards and action necessary to implement the articulated curricula required. In addition, there was a charge to the Board of Regents and other education management boards relative to implementation of the plan.

That model did and continues to enhance upward mobility in nursing education within Louisiana. The enclosed document reflects a refinement and update of that model. Revisions are proposed to augment the progression of individuals through all levels of nursing education from nursing assistant to registered nurse.

The revisions allow for:

- Streamlining of the current process of awarding transfer and advanced placement credit at all levels
- Continuity across programs in the process of awarding transfer and advanced placement nursing credit
- Greater ease in the transfer process for students
- Ease in awarding transfer and advanced placement credit for the educational institution
- A decrease in the time it takes a student to graduate, which addresses also, the current health care personnel shortages

The revisions bring the model in line with national trends and also make it consistent with national articulation models.

Definition:

- Articulation is defined as a process through which academic programs facilitate the educational progress with minimal loss of credit and duplication of knowledge and skills.

Goals:

- To facilitate the educational mobility of nursing personnel across the state
- To increase the nursing health care workforce
- To provide seamless progression in nursing education
- To meet the educational needs of the citizens of Louisiana
- To assure a qualified healthcare workforce that meets the health care needs of the state

Assumptions:

- There is a common core of knowledge, attitudes, cognitive and psychomotor skills that graduates of all three types of nursing programs should acquire; however, there are distinct differences in the breadth, depth, scope of preparation and knowledge of each type of graduate¹
- Not every individual wishes to seek credentials at the next practice level, however, the opportunity for academic progression should be available for those that wish to do so
- Clinical experiences at each level contribute to the overall knowledge base
- Public awareness of articulation initiatives is critical to their success
- Adherence to Board of Regents transfer matrix for general education courses is occurring at all public post-secondary educational institutions in the state

Implementation Standards:

- Each school must have autonomy to set admission/progression/graduation requirements
- Nursing programs in practical, associate and baccalaureate degree programs must meet standards determined by the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners or Louisiana State Board of Nursing
- All graduates must meet minimum program and curriculum standards
- Any articulation plan must maintain professional standards and promote quality instruction
- Articulation plans must adhere to the standards of higher education regulatory boards
- Articulation is a mandatory process for all nursing education programs in Louisiana
- Adequate faculty and clinical practice facilities are available to support the program

General Expectations Of All Students:

- Student must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School/Technical Program
- Student must meet all prerequisite and/or general education core requirements
- Student must be a graduate of a Certified Nursing Assistant Program, approved Practical Nurse program or an accredited Diploma or Associate degree program in nursing
- Student must be certified as a nursing assistant or licensed as a practical nurse or a registered nurse in Louisiana

Articulation Plan

Nursing Assistants to LPN

Practical Nursing programs will award a minimum of 3 semester credit hours or the equivalent to a certified nursing assistant upon validation of clinical competencies.

- Must meet admission requirements for the program
- Must be certified as a nursing assistant in Louisiana
- Competency testing may be required
- Work experience may be required

LPN to RN (Associate Degree in Nursing)

A minimum of 12 semester credit hours of nursing credit will be awarded to Licensed Practical Nurses entering an Associate Degree Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of any general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School
- Must have completed general education/prerequisite coursework
- Must be a graduate of an approved LPN Program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a practical nurse in the State of Louisiana
- Competency testing/credit examinations may be required.
- Work experience may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in one year of full time continuous study.

LPN to RN (Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing)

A minimum of 12 semester credit hours of nursing credit will be awarded to Licensed Practical Nurses entering a Baccalaureate Degree Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of any general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School
- Must have completed general education/prerequisite coursework
- Must be a graduate of an approved LPN Program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a practical nurse in the State of Louisiana
- Competency testing/credit examinations may be required
- Work experience may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in two years of full time continuous study.

Associate Degree/Diploma to Baccalaureate Degree

A minimum of at least ½ the credit hours in the nursing courses required will be awarded to the student pursuing a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of the general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirement of the University/ College/School
- Must meet general education/prerequisite requirements
- Must be a graduate of an accredited associate degree or diploma-nursing program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a registered nurse in Louisiana
- Work experience may be required
- Competency testing may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in one year of full time continuous study.

Additional Notes:

Institutions will follow Institutional policy relative to the age of coursework being transferred.

All public institutions must follow the Board of Regents Transfer Matrix for transfer of General Education Courses.

The Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners will take action to allow for full implementation of the Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model by Fall 2005.

The Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model will be implemented fully for all new students entering in Fall 2005.

The Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners are charged with assuring compliance in implementation of and ongoing utilization of the Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model and will report annually to appropriate official public agencies through the annual reports of the respective Boards.
