

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INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, for the year beginning January 1, 2004 and ending December 31, 2004, has been prepared in accordance with La. R.S. 37:911 et seq., particularly La. R.S. 37:918.10, which provides that the Board shall "publish an annual report for distribution to the Governor and Legislature."

During 2004, the Board of Nursing met a total of eleven (11) days in Board meetings, including five (5) days of open business sessions, seven (7) days of closed disciplinary sessions, one (1) day of special call meetings. In addition, the Board met a total of nine (9) days in committee meetings and three (3) days in subcommittees, including four (4) Administrative Committee meetings, five (5) Credentialing Committee meetings, four (4) Education Committee meetings, four (4) Compliance Committee meetings, four (4) Practice Committee meetings, two (2) Advisory Council meetings, two (2) Practice Committee Focus Group meetings on RNs delegating selected nursing tasks to trained unlicensed nursing personnel, three (3) Nursing Supply and Demand Commission, five (5) Nursing Supply and Demand Subcommittee meetings. Members of the Board met a total of eight (8) days for Disciplinary Settlement Hearings. The actions taken at these meetings are reported among the activities of the Board.

In addition to the activities of the Board, the Report presents the current organization of the Board of Nursing, as well as the goals and objectives of the Board and the significant activities of the Board's professional staff. Statistical data depicting the current status of the Board-approved nursing education programs are presented in tabulated form for each reference. Also depicted in the statistical data are characteristics of the licensee population.

The intent of the 2004 Annual Report is to document objective data that can be used in planning and decision-making relative to nursing.

MISSION STATEMENT

To safeguard the life and health of the citizens of Louisiana by assuring persons practicing as registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses are competent and safe.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal I: Promote regulatory effectiveness.

Objectives:

1. Identify performance indicators for each major function, incorporating national benchmarking: licensing (RN & APRN); approval of educational programs; practice standards; compliance processes; and Recovery Nurse Program.
2. Develop and implement tools for measuring performance and continuous quality improvement.
3. Evaluate the regulatory effectiveness of jurisdiction over student nurses.
4. Develop system for criminal background checks on all applicants for clinical nursing courses.
5. Develop processes for verifying standards in Chapter 45 for programs preparing graduates for APRN licensure.
6. Use survey results from National Council State Boards of Nursing Excellence Project to improve services.

Goal II: Assure efficient and timely responses to nursing issues affecting patient safety.

1. Fully implement and evaluate priority system.
2. Develop and implement tools to facilitate investigative process.
3. Revise disciplinary section guidelines.
4. Revise policy regarding delay/denial of licensure.
5. Evaluate the regional system.

Goal III: Enhance image and visibility of the Board.

1. Provide presentations to undergraduate and graduate students in nursing programs.
2. Complete needs assessment to determine learning needs/interest of licensees as related to Board functions.
3. Conduct educational programs regionally to meet learning needs/interests of licenses as identified above.
4. Identify and enhance new means of communication/information sharing in addition to the Examiner.
5. Participate in liaison activities with other interested groups.
6. Initiate program to improve the communication/customer service of all office staff with the public.

Goal IV: Identify and regulate evolving role of the registered nurse and advanced practice registered nurse as a professional while protecting the public.

1. Complete the credentialing standards and promulgation of the rules for controlled substances for APRNs.
2. Evaluate the emerging roles of APRNs.
3. Explore the differentiation of nursing roles in accordance with educational preparation.
4. Identify critical patient safety issues related to the accessibility of properly prepared registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses and work collectively with nursing organizations, healthcare providers and other regulatory agencies to resolve.
5. Identify, analyze, and disseminate ongoing changes to RN scope of practice to consumers.

Goal V: Facilitate board and staff development.

1. Develop a self-assessment process for board members and staff.
2. Support the continuous development of board and staff.
3. Support and embrace the strategic plan.
4. Evaluate orientation plan for new board members.
5. Establish mechanisms for improving internal communications.

MAJOR ACTIONS REGARDING ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS:

Accepted the Vice-President's Report and Second Quarter Financial Statement Report for October 1, 2003 – December 31, 2003.

Accepted the Vice-President's Report and Third Quarter Financial Statement Report for January 1, 2004 – March 31, 2004.

MAJOR ACTIONS REGARDING CREDENTIALING MATTERS:

Approved the revised list of Nursing Specialty Organizations with continuing education requirements comparable to the LSBN continuing education requirements for relicensure.

Approved the Chapter 45 proposed revisions as LSBN working draft number one and that it is referred back to the Credentialing Committee and Education Committee for further work and that interested parties such as health care facilities and education programs are given a copy of the working draft.

Accepted that the policy for licensure of foreign nurse graduates reflect acceptance of a notarized affidavit confirming a social security number as a part of the licensure process that requires a social security number.

Approved that Administrative Rule LAC 46:XLVII.3329.C be reconfirmed and that rule change to permit temporary permits for foreign nurse graduates not be instituted.

Approved 45-day NCLEX-RN retest policy.

Motioned and Approved that the Board establish a special committee of the Board to review comments on working drafts one and two of Chapter 45 and make recommendations to the Board regarding the proposed rules. Suggestions: To include four Board members. Also, to include one representative from Louisiana Association of Nurse Practitioners, Louisiana State Nurse Association, Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners, Louisiana State Board of Pharmacy to review and comment without voting rights.

Denied the appeal by Ann Clark Whitlock, ANP, WHNP, to reconsider the Credentialing Committee's decision to deny her an exception to the 500 hours of clinical practice prior to application for prescriptive authority.

Accepted Credentialing Committee recommendations regarding the issue of APRNs being granted authority to prescribe Schedule II drugs.

Ratified one Recall of Temporary Permit.

Approved Chapter 45 proposed revisions as LSBN Working Document No. 3.

Directed staff to distribute Chapter 45 Working Document No. 3 to interested parties such as health care facilities and education programs and place it on Louisiana State Board of Nursing's website for review and comment by November 15, 2004. If substantial comments are received schedule a special call Chapter 45 Subcommittee meeting to discuss. Furthermore, that the

proposed Chapter 45 revisions be placed on the December Board meeting agenda for proposed rulemaking.

Accepted the comments submitted regarding Louisiana State Board of Nursing's Chapter 45 Working Draft #3 and refer the Working Document Draft #3 to the original LSBN subcommittee to review Chapter 45 to prepare LSBN Chapter 45 Working Document Draft #4 for action at a Special Call Board meeting in conjunction with the January Committee meeting dates.

Accepted the Annual Report from Baton Rouge General Medical Center Diploma in nursing program, continue full approval, and commend them for a 100% NCLEX-RN pass rate for the second consecutive year.

While 4.7% of the faculty is part-time, there is balanced graduate preparation among the faculty. A survey visit is due in spring 2005.

Accepted the Annual Report from Nicholls State University Associate Degree in Nursing program, continue full approval, and commend them for a 100% NCLEX-RN pass rate for the second consecutive year.

Approved that action on the request to implement the LPN to RN program in Shreveport, agenda item 4.3.3, be delayed pending a site visit to the facilities, verification of clinical space, and a review of specific faculty credentials.

Accepted the request of Delta Community College (DCC) to withdraw Agenda Item 4.4., requesting a site-visit for initial approval of an associate degree in nursing program. Correspondence from DCC stated that they had withdrawn their application for SACS-COC candidacy with plans to resubmit in 2005.

SUMMARY REPORT OF NURSING COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES - 2004

In 2004, during five (5) scheduled formal disciplinary hearings, the Board heard 490 disciplinary cases within nine (9) days of closed Board hearings. These cases involved: formal complaints against licensees, applicants or students; reinstatement requests from licensees with suspended licenses; consent agreements; ratification of staff actions for automatic suspensions or denials of licensure, and review of Settlement Orders.

During 2004, the disciplinary section received 762 complaints against registered nurses, registered nurse applicants, or students requiring preliminary investigation. Not counted as complaints are anonymous letters and telephone calls received each month which involve disciplinary matters, but which fail to produce sufficient evidence to begin an investigation.

After investigating the various complaints and based on the information received, the Board of Nursing issued two hundred fifty-seven (257) official charges, Show Cause Orders, or notice of complaints. After hearing the charges or accepting a total of three hundred twenty-seven (327) Consent Orders, a 68% increase from 2003, and seventeen (17) Settlement Orders, the Board suspended a total of thirty-seven (37) licenses, and additionally ratified eighty-three (83) automatic suspensions issued by staff. Seventeen (17) licenses were summarily suspended, and eleven (11) licenses were voluntarily surrendered. Three (3) licenses were revoked. Seventy-five (75) licenses were suspended with stay, or retained with stipulations or probations, and eighty-seven (87) licensees were reprimanded.

A total of forty-five (45) individuals requested reinstatement of suspended licenses. Of these, forty-two (42) licenses were reinstated, three (3) denied.

This year, one hundred twenty-three (123) students or applicants for NCLEX-RN came before the Board, primarily to respond to prior criminal convictions. Of this number, twenty-nine (29) students were granted approval to continue in clinical nursing courses, and fifty-five (55) students were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met. Twenty-eight (28) student applicants were granted approval for NCLEX-RN or licensure, and fourteen (14) applicants were denied, or delayed until certain stipulations were met.

905 investigations were resolved.

**SUMMARY REPORT ON RENEWAL OF LICENSEES WITH DEFAULTED
STUDENT LOANS**

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, The Louisiana State Board of Nursing withheld the 2005 licensure renewal applications of fifty-one (51) registered nurses who were deemed by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) to be in default of a student loan.

On October 7, 2004, certified letters were mailed notifying these registered nurses that their 2005 renewal application would be withheld until the Board received notification from LOSFA that payment arrangements had been made. As of January 31, 2005, forty-one (41) of the fifty-one (51) individuals had complied with LOSFA and were issued renewal applications. The remaining ten (10) registered nurses did not comply, were placed on a delinquent licensure status and were not able to practice in Louisiana.



SUMMARY REPORT ON RELICENSURE AUDIT

The Continuing Education Audit for compliance in 2004 is in progress. One thousand two hundred and eight (1,208) RNs were randomly selected and notifications were sent out March 7, 2005. April 7, 2005 was the deadline for responses. As of April 11, 2005, 938 or 78% of the RNs selected have verified compliance.

Licensees who have not satisfactorily met the audit or falsified the licensure renewal application are subject to have their licenses invalidated and disciplinary action imposed.

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2004, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) was administered to **2030** candidates for licensure by examination using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). Of this number **1723** individuals were licensed. There were **1572** graduates from **21** nursing programs in Louisiana who tested for the first time during 2004. Of this number, **1425** were licensed; thereby, achieving a ninety percent (90.6%) pass rate for first time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana. This is above the national average of eighty-five percent (85%).

INDIVIDUALS REVIEWED BY THE BOARD DUE TO CRIMINAL ARREST/CHARGES, ADDICTION, IMPAIRMENT OR PRIOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

GRADUATES:

There were **201** candidates testing who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, and/or disciplinary action by another Board.

There were **1,682** criminal record checks processed by finger print cards on applicants for licensure by examination.

STUDENTS:

There were **469** students requesting approval from the Board to enter or continue in clinical nursing courses, who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, or disciplinary action by another Board.
