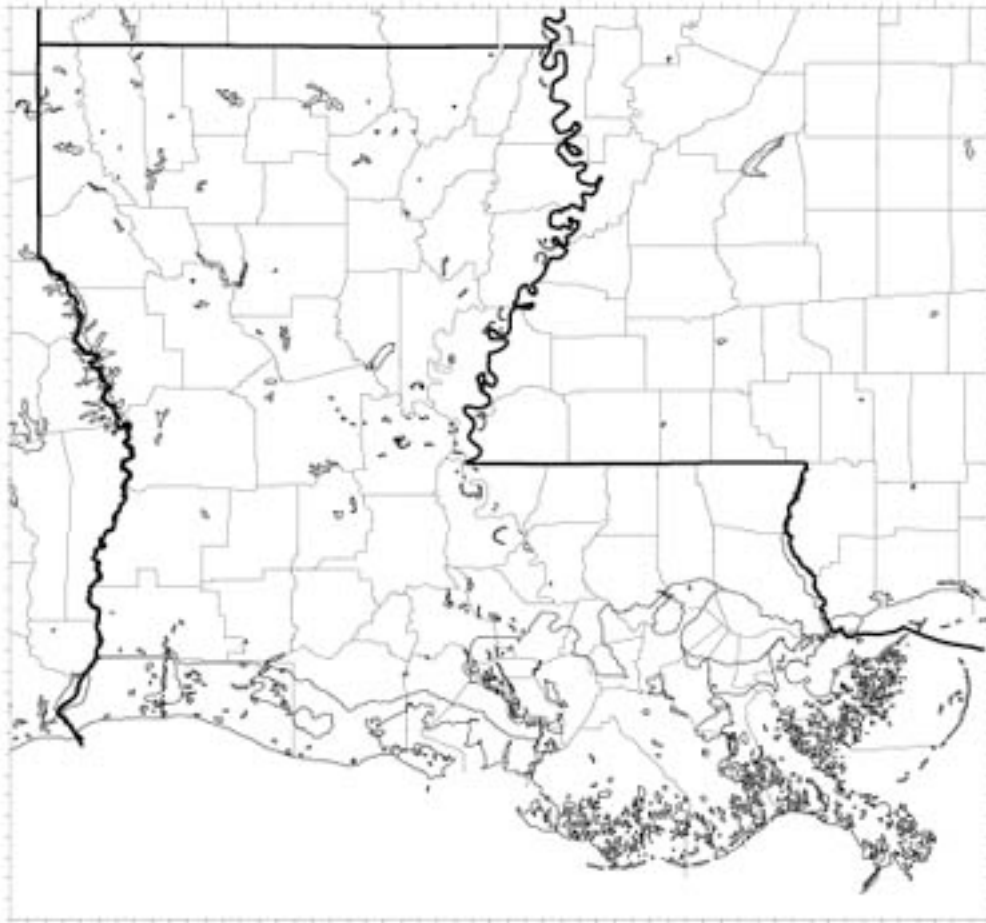

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INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, for the year beginning January 1, 2006 and ending December 31, 2006, was prepared in accordance with LA R.S. 37:911 et seq., particularly LA R.S. 37:918.10, which provides that the Board shall “publish an annual report for distribution to the Governor and Legislature.” The purpose of this report is to present data on the activities of the Board and to provide data relative to the registered nurse population in Louisiana.

In 2006, the Board of Nursing met a total of twelve (12) days in Board meetings, including four (4) days of open business sessions and eight (8) days of closed disciplinary sessions. Further, the Board met a total of four (4) days in committee meetings, that included four (4) days Administrative Committee meetings, four (4) days Credentialing Committee meetings, four (4) days Education Committee meetings, three (3) days Compliance Committee meetings, and four (4) days Practice Committee meetings. In addition, the Board met a total of two (2) days in Advisory Council meetings and one (1) day in a subcommittee meeting. The actions taken at these meetings are reported among the activities of the Board.

This report also presents the current organization of the Board of Nursing as well as the goals and objectives of the Board and the significant activities of the professional staff. Statistical data regarding the admission, enrollment and graduation data from the Board-approved nursing education programs is presented in tabulated form for each reference. Statistical data depicting the characteristics of the licensee population is included.

The 2006 Annual Report contains objective data that can be used in planning and decision-making relative to professional nursing in Louisiana.

MISSION STATEMENT

To safeguard the life and health of the citizens of Louisiana by assuring persons practicing as registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses are competent and safe.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal I: Promote regulatory effectiveness.

Objectives:

1. Identify performance indicators for each major function, incorporating national benchmarking: licensing (RN & APRN); approval of educational programs; practice standards; compliance processes; and Recovery Nurse Program.
2. Develop and implement tools for measuring performance and continuous quality improvement.
3. Develop business continuation/disaster plan.
3. Collect and analyze the criminal background data on student nurses to evaluate the regulatory effectiveness of jurisdiction over student nurses.
4. Provide guidance and consistency to nursing schools regarding the denial of students entering clinicals.
5. Establish permanent headquarters in Baton Rouge metropolitan area to promote regulatory effectiveness that meets staff and board needs.
6. Recruit qualified staff to fill vacancy.

Goal II: Assure efficient and timely responses to nursing issues affecting patient safety.

1. Develop and implement tools to facilitate investigative process and establish better staff workloads.
2. Revise policy regarding delay/denial of licensure enhancing the disciplinary process and student nurses.
3. Evaluate the remote placement of Regional Managers.

4. Provide presentations to undergraduate and graduate students in nursing programs and licensees.
5. Evaluate the regional system.

Goal III: Enhance image and visibility of the Board.

1. Provide presentations to undergraduate and graduate students in nursing programs and licensees.
2. Participate in liaison activities with other interested groups.
3. Collaborate with the Board of Regents and LPN board to expand the nursing programs in order to alleviate the nursing shortage crisis that exists in Louisiana as mandated by SCR 134.

Goal IV: Identify and regulate evolving role of the registered nurse and advanced practice registered nurse as a professional while protecting the public.

1. Monitor the emerging roles of APRNs.
2. Identify critical data related to the accessibility of properly prepared registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses and work collectively with nursing organizations, healthcare providers, and other regulatory agencies to resolve needs.
3. Continue to develop consumer information section on website, and more timely updates to the website.

Goal V: Facilitate board and staff development.

1. Support the continuous development of board and staff.
2. Support and embrace the strategic plan.
3. Establish mechanisms for improving internal communications.
4. Train new staff and stabilize the workforce.

Approved LSBN Staff's recommendation to extend time period of LSBN's Administrative Policy 5.6 Disaster Relief Permit from June 30, 2006 through October 31, 2006.

CREDENTIALING ISSUES:

Approved that a subcommittee of the Credentialing Committee be established to make recommendations regarding whether to remove the 500 clinical hours requirement for APRNs to qualify for initial prescriptive authority. It was approved that the subcommittee membership be comprised of a member of LANP, LSNA, LANA, LSMS, LSBN ex-officio physician, and educators who teach advanced practice curriculum.

Accepted the report of the Prescription Monitoring Task Force recommendations and legislation.

Accepted the report on the status of the Task Force regarding the review of 500 clinical hours requirement for APRNs to qualify for initial prescriptive authority.

Accepted the update from the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Vision Paper: The Future of Advanced Practice.

Accepted the report of the Task Force for review of 500 clinical hours requirements for APRN’s to qualify for initial prescriptive authority. The report included that the Credentialing Committee voted to direct Board staff to prepare a draft for rulemaking changes to LAC 46:LXVII., Chapter 45 to include prescriptive authority with initial licensure for Nurse Practitioners.

Approved the request of East Texas Baptist University for the use of clinical facilities for student clinical teaching at LSUHSC in Shreveport if verification is obtained regarding faculty meeting faculty credentials criteria of the Board, LAC 46:XLVII.3515 as well as document events of coordination/collaboration with our programs in Louisiana.

Accepted NCLEX Pass Rates for 2005.

Approved action on programs with less than 80% pass rate and action on those who were on conditional approval who have exceeded 80% pass rates for 2005 to include the following:

- Placing Dillard University on conditional approval for the second consecutive year due to an NCLEX pass rate of 77.78% for 2005 in accordance with LAC46:XLVII.3523.B., *the Nursing Education programs shall have a pass rate of 80% or greater achieved by the candidates taking the licensure examination for the first time in any one January to December calendar year, or the program shall be placed on conditional approval.*

- Removing McNeese State University Associate Degree Nursing Program from conditional approval for achieving greater than 80% NCLEX pass rate in 2005.
- Removing Our Lady of the Lake College's accelerated program from conditional approval for achieving greater than 80% NCLEX pass rate in 2005.
- Removing University of Louisiana at Monroe from conditional approval for achieving greater than 80% NCLEX rate in 2005.

Approved to initiate rulemaking for changes in LAC 46:XLVII.3515.B.7.a.b., for an increase in the time that a program may request for a faculty exception, in 3515.B.7.a., change one calendar year to two calendar years in any consecutive five year period; and in b., change three calendar years to four calendar years.

Recommended recognition of graduates of the RN to MSN program at Louisiana State University Health Science Center as having preparation equivalent to a baccalaureate and a master's in nursing (LAC 46:XLVII.3515.b.4) for those individuals seeking faculty positions in Louisiana nursing programs.

Accepted the progress report from William Carey College.

Acknowledged the report from Our Lady of the Lake College reflecting the status of the accelerated program housed at Tulane University Hospital and Clinic including a list of assigned faculty and a summary of physical resources.

Acknowledged the report from our Lady of the Lake College relative to the recommendation to report efforts to achieve 100% masters in nursing prepared faculty.

Acknowledged Baton Rouge Community College's documentation for Step II §3533.B, and authorized a site visit to be made by Board staff prior to the December Board meeting to facilitate action by the Board on initial approval of the program to authorize admission of students as early as Spring 2007. Initial approval will be based on authorization to initiate the program by the Board of Regents and on information gathered by a site visit to verify that the standards of the Board in §3533 are documented; and pursuant to the site visit conducted November 29, 2006, that the Baton Rouge Community College be authorized to initiate the Associate of Science in Nursing program when the following stipulations are met:

1. Approval from the Board of Regents
2. Approval from SACS-COC
3. Approval of the first cohort of students by the LSBN relative to criminal history records

Approved the request of East Texas Baptist University for the use of Brentwood Hospital in Shreveport for Student Clinical Teaching.

Approved the request of Delgado/Charity School of Nursing to proceed with implementation of the distant education initiative of offering their program in the Monroe area when the following stipulations are met:

1. Verification of employment of qualified faculty for the Monroe area.
2. Written evidence of cooperation and collaboration with other programs using the clinical facilities.
3. Provide copies of contractual agreements with clinical facilities.
4. Host an on-site visit by an LSBN representative to verify resources.

Accepted the following announcements for information:

- Grambling University announced that Dr. Betty Smith has been named Dean, College of Professional Studies and that Dr. Rhonda Hensley has been named Acting Associate Dean, School of Nursing.
- University of Louisiana at Lafayette announced that they are recipients of a gratis faculty position from Doctor's Hospital.
- Southern University – Baton Rouge announced that Dr. Jacqueline Hill has been named Interim Chair of the Baccalaureate Program replacing Mrs. Mary Abadie.
- Our Lady of the Lake College announced that the Accelerated ASN Program at Our Lady of the Lake College will be offered at both the Baton Rouge and New Orleans campuses.

COMPLIANCE ISSUES:

Approved policy "Guidelines for Applicants with Criminal Record" to supersede Board policy entitled "Arrest/Conviction Record Guidelines for Applicants."

Approved the policy “Applicant’s Failure to Disclose Criminal History.”

Accepted the proposed revisions in Rule LAC 46:XLVII.3329 Temporary Permits for rulemaking.

Approved to increase the frequency of drug screening to 18-24 times during the first year of monitoring and a minimum of twelve times for the second year (Active RNs – 24 times the first year; Suspended RNs working toward compliance and students – 18 times the first year).

ADVISORY COUNCIL:

Accepted the report of the Advisory Council.

Accepted the report of the September 11, 2006 Advisory Council Meeting.

NURSING PRACTICE ISSUES:

Approved that the issue of administration of Natreacor in the home setting with RN supervision be **deferred** until then next meeting and further that petitioner attend the next meeting to clarify the request or withdraw the petition.

Approved the Practice Committee’s recommendations regarding the administration of radionucleotides, namely cardiolite and neurolite, which are tracer elements used for cardiac stress testing and for focal seizure diagnosis, that staff contacts the petitioners to explain the present law and recommend alternatives to pursue.

Approved that the Board upholds the previous opinion 96.07 in regard to rapid sequence induction/intubation and further approves that it is within the scope of practice for the RN as a member of a rapid response team to administer medication at the direction of the attending physician who is present and has designated the situation as an emergency (an acute, life-threatening event) with the following provisos:

1. The physician has ordered the rapid sequence induction/intubation, medication to be administered and is present at the bedside.
2. There is institutional policy and procedure developed to guide the RN in this emergency process.
3. The nurse has the knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the medication administration.
4. All equipment needed for resuscitation, hemodynamic support, and monitoring is available at the bedside.
5. The competency of the registered nurse is verified and documentation of competency is contained in the file of the registered nurse. The competency is renewed and documented annually.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for a registered nurse (RN) to administer and delegate to the licensed practical nurse (LNP) ultraviolet light therapy as ordered by the physician provided the compliance with the rules on delegation LAC 46:XLVII.3703 a-d is maintained and competency of the LPN is shown.

Approved that the decision be **deferred** as to whether it is within the scope of practice for the registered nurse (RN) to prepare and administer topical medications involving the preparation of a combination of medications if they are prepared for single use and administered by the person preparing the dose to obtain information from the Board of Pharmacy.

Approved to table the decision on whether it is within the scope of practice for the RN to perform class IV laser procedures under the direct supervision of a qualified physician. It was **deferred** back to the Practice Committee for further information and study.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for the RN/APRN to provide neurofeedback services provided the RN has the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the procedures safely and competently and the procedure is ordered by an authorized prescriber.

Accepted the Practice Committee's recommendation to withdraw the petition for an opinion of "administration of Anterior in the home setting with RN supervision" since the petitioner did not attend the Practice Committee meeting to clarify the request and provide additional information.

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for the registered nurse (RN) to prepare and administer topical medication involving the preparation of a combination of medications if they are prepared for single use and administered by the person preparing the dose.

Accepted the Practice Committee's recommendation to refer "whether it is within the scope of practice for the RN to perform class IV laser procedures under the direct supervision of a qualified physician" back to the next Practice Committee for approval of staff's drafted language.

Accepted the Practice Committee's decision to continue the request from Spine Diagnostics Center of Baton Rouge, Inc. until the next Practice Committee at the request of the practitioner.

Approved that it is not within the scope of practice for the RN to delegate the complex task such as medication administration to an Ophthalmic Medical Technologist (OMT).

Approved that it is within the scope of practice for the RN to perform Class IV laser procedures under the direct supervision of a qualified physician with the following provisos:

- the procedures are non-ablative
- the MD/authorized prescriber possesses the specific knowledge, experience and expertise in laser therapy
- the MD/authorized prescriber assesses the patient prior to each procedure, gives specific orders and is physically present on the premises and immediately available
- the procedure be performed in a medical facility or medical office
- the RN has the knowledge, skills and ability to safely and competently perform the procedure
- the education and training of the RN to perform the procedure be documented, and
- the patient is informed that the RN will perform the procedure

Accepted the Practice Committee's clarification to the petitioner regarding the Declaratory Statement, *a registered nurse (non-CRNA) will not monitor an adult patient with an ASA classification higher than Class III and a pediatric patient higher than Class II for deep*

sedation. The RN may monitor an adult patient with an ASA classification higher than Class III and a pediatric patient higher than Class II for minimal or moderate sedation.

Accepted the Practice Committee's recommendation to continue the request from the East Baton Rouge Parish School System (EBRPSS) until the next Practice Committee regarding whether non-complex procedures can be delegated to certified/licensed health care professionals who are contracted employees of the East Baton Rouge Parish School System.

Approved to amend the Declaratory Statement regarding the Transmission and Acceptance of Verbal Orders to include removing the language "*for said licensed practical nurse's patient*".

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF STATE BOARDS OF NURSING:

Accepted that the nominations for this year's awards will be submitted by April 16th. The APRN Advisory Panel has been working on the APRN Vision Paper and is soliciting comments from Member Boards and APRN stakeholder groups.

OTHER:

Accepted report on the Prescription Monitory Program.

Approved to authorize the Executive Director to negotiate an offer and execute a purchase agreement and enter into a loan agreement to purchase property located at 17373 Perkins Road, Baton Rouge, LA 70810.

Approved to defer to the Credentialing Committee the request from Joni Nickens, President of the Louisiana Association of Nurse Practitioners, requesting the Board to consider removing the 500 hour restriction for obtaining prescriptive authority from the rules.

Accepted proposal request from Louisiana Health Review, Inc. (LHCR) for "Find LANURSES.com" and recommended for collaborative effort to establish web-based database for displaced Louisiana nurses and interested volunteers to be identified in a time of disaster.

Adopted a resolution authorizing the issuance of Two Million Two Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,235,000) of Revenue Bonds, Series 2006, of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, prescribing the form, fixing the details and providing for the payment thereof, confirming the sale of the Bonds and entering into certain other covenants and agreements in connection with the security and payment of said Bonds, authorizing the publication of a Notice of Intention, and providing for other matters in connection therewith. This will allow LSBN to acquire property located at 17373 Perkins Road, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and pay a portion of the costs through the issuance of Revenue Bonds.

Accepted the report of the meeting held on November 1, 2006 on Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 134 of the Regular Legislative Session to study the feasibility of expanding nursing programs in order to alleviate the nursing shortage crisis that exists in Louisiana.

SUMMARY REPORT OF NURSING COMPLIANCE ACTIVITIES - 2006

In 2006, during four (4) scheduled formal disciplinary hearings, the Board heard 346 disciplinary cases during closed Board Hearings. These cases involved: formal complaints against licensees, applicants or students; reinstatement requests from licensees with suspended licenses; consent agreements; ratification of staff actions for automatic suspensions, denial/delay of licensure or students for clinical nursing courses, and review of Settlement Orders.

During 2006, the disciplinary section received 1297 complaints against registered nurses, registered nurse applicants, or students requiring preliminary investigation. Not counted as complaints are anonymous letters and telephone calls received each month which involve disciplinary matters, but which fail to produce sufficient evidence to begin an investigation.

After investigating the various complaints and based on the information received, a total of three hundred ten (310) disciplinary actions were taken. Of this number, a total of one hundred six (106) students or applicants for NCLEX-RN came before the Board, primarily to respond to prior criminal convictions.

During this year, a total of (61) individuals requested reinstatement of suspended licenses. Of these, fifty-six (56) licenses were reinstated, four (4) denied and one (1) granted "inactive".

Also during the year, 648 investigations were closed without formal disciplinary action.

**SUMMARY REPORT ON
RENEWAL OF LICENSEES WITH DEFAULTED STUDENT LOANS**

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing withheld the 2007 licensure renewal applications of forty-three (43) registered nurses who were deemed by the Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA) to be in default of a student loan.

Certified letters were mailed notifying these registered nurses that their 2007 renewal could not be processed until the Board received notification from LOSFA that payment arrangements had been made. As of April 16, 2007, forty (40) of the forty-three (43) individuals had complied with LOSFA and were permitted to seek licensure renewal. The remaining three (3) were placed on a delinquent licensure status and were not able to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana.

SUMMARY REPORT ON RELICENSURE AUDIT

The 2005 continuing education requirements for relicensure were furloughed due to the impact of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Therefore, it was not necessary to conduct an audit in 2006. Continuing education requirements for relicensure were required in 2006 for licensure renewal for 2007 and an audit will be performed in the spring of 2007.

NURSING EDUCATION ARTICULATION IN LOUISIANA

The Louisiana Nursing Articulation Model was developed in 2005 to assure that Louisiana programs in nursing were providing opportunities for articulation for the Louisiana nurse population. The model has been adopted by both regulatory boards of nursing and is in place in all programs preparing for RN licensure. In 2006, there were five hundred eighty-four (584) licensed practical nurses enrolled in programs preparing for RN licensure and there were two hundred forty (240) RNs enrolled who were seeking baccalaureate degrees.

The model is comprehensive and is consistent with trends throughout the United States. The model is as follows:

Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model

Overview:

Through Act 818 of the 1991 Louisiana Legislature, the Nursing Supply and Demand Commission (NSDC) was established and charged, in part, with the responsibility of developing an articulation model that was organized and integrated in such a fashion to permit the maximum amount of prior training to be credited against the requirements of any subsequent nursing education program(s). This plan was to include nursing assistant through the baccalaureate degree in nursing. To this end, the NSDC adopted an articulation model in 1993 entitled Articulation Plan for Nursing in Louisiana and presented the report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Health and Welfare on April 6, 1993. Through this legislation, the nursing boards were charged with review of standards and action necessary to implement the articulated curricula required. In addition, there was a charge to the Board of Regents and other education management boards relative to implementation of the plan.

That model did and continues to enhance upward mobility in nursing education within Louisiana. The enclosed document reflects a refinement and update of that model. Revisions are proposed to augment the progression of individuals through all levels of nursing education from nursing assistant to registered nurse.

The revisions allow for:

- Streamlining of the current process of awarding transfer and advanced placement credit at all levels
- Continuity across programs in the process of awarding transfer and advanced placement nursing credit
- Greater ease in the transfer process for students
- Ease in awarding transfer and advanced placement credit for the educational institution
- A decrease in the time it takes a student to graduate, which addresses also, the current health care personnel shortages

The revisions bring the model in line with national trends and also make it consistent with national articulation models.

Definition:

- Articulation is defined as a process through which academic programs facilitate the educational progress with minimal loss of credit and duplication of knowledge and skills.

Goals:

- To facilitate the educational mobility of nursing personnel across the state
- To increase the nursing health care workforce
- To provide seamless progression in nursing education
- To meet the educational needs of the citizens of Louisiana
- To assure a qualified healthcare workforce that meets the health care needs of the state

Assumptions:

- There is a common core of knowledge, attitudes, cognitive and psychomotor skills that graduates of all three types of nursing programs should acquire; however, there are distinct differences in the breadth, depth, scope of preparation and knowledge of each type of graduate¹
- Not every individual wishes to seek credentials at the next practice level, however, the opportunity for academic progression should be available for those that wish to do so
- Clinical experiences at each level contribute to the overall knowledge base
- Public awareness of articulation initiatives is critical to their success
- Adherence to Board of Regents transfer matrix for general education courses is occurring at all public post-secondary educational institutions in the state

Implementation Standards:

- Each school must have autonomy to set admission/progression/graduation requirements
- Nursing programs in practical, associate and baccalaureate degree programs must meet standards determined by the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners or Louisiana State Board of Nursing
- All graduates must meet minimum program and curriculum standards
- Any articulation plan must maintain professional standards and promote quality instruction
- Articulation plans must adhere to the standards of higher education regulatory boards
- Articulation is a mandatory process for all nursing education programs in Louisiana
- Adequate faculty and clinical practice facilities are available to support the program

General Expectations Of All Students:

- Student must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School/Technical Program
- Student must meet all prerequisite and/or general education core requirements
- Student must be a graduate of a Certified Nursing Assistant Program, approved Practical Nurse program or an accredited Diploma or Associate degree program in nursing
- Student must be certified as a nursing assistant or licensed as a practical nurse or a registered nurse in Louisiana

Articulation Plan

Nursing Assistants to LPN

Practical Nursing programs will award a minimum of 3 semester credit hours or the equivalent to a certified nursing assistant upon validation of clinical competencies.

- Must meet admission requirements for the program
- Must be certified as a nursing assistant in Louisiana
- Competency testing may be required
- Work experience may be required

LPN to RN (Associate Degree in Nursing)

A minimum of 12 semester credit hours of nursing credit will be awarded to Licensed Practical Nurses entering an Associate Degree Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of any general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School
- Must have completed general education/prerequisite coursework
- Must be a graduate of an approved LPN Program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a practical nurse in the State of Louisiana
- Competency testing/credit examinations may be required.
- Work experience may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in one year of full time continuous study.

LPN to RN (Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing)

A minimum of 12 semester credit hours of nursing credit will be awarded to Licensed Practical Nurses entering a Baccalaureate Degree Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of any general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirements of the University/College/School
- Must have completed general education/prerequisite coursework
- Must be a graduate of an approved LPN Program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a practical nurse in the State of Louisiana
- Competency testing/credit examinations may be required
- Work experience may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in two years of full time continuous study.

Associate Degree/Diploma to Baccalaureate Degree

A minimum of at least ½ the credit hours in the nursing courses required will be awarded to the student pursuing a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing Program in Louisiana after completion of the general education, prerequisite, and transitional course requirements.

- Must meet admission requirement of the University/ College/School
- Must meet general education/prerequisite requirements
- Must be a graduate of an accredited associate degree or diploma-nursing program
- Must hold an unencumbered license as a registered nurse in Louisiana
- Work experience may be required
- Competency testing may be required

Once admitted to the professional component of the program, this program can typically be completed in one year of full time continuous study.

Additional Notes:

Institutions will follow Institutional policy relative to the age of coursework being transferred.

All public institutions must follow the Board of Regents Transfer Matrix for transfer of General Education Courses.

The Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners will take action to allow for full implementation of the Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model by Fall 2005.

The Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model will be implemented fully for all new students entering in Fall 2005.

The Louisiana State Board of Nursing and the Louisiana State Board of Practical Nurse Examiners are charged with assuring compliance in implementation of and ongoing utilization of the Louisiana Nursing Education Articulation Model and will report annually to appropriate official public agencies through the annual reports of the respective Boards.

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2006, the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) was administered to **2,289** candidates for licensure by examination using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). Of this number **1,962** individuals were licensed. There were **1,854** graduates from **22** nursing programs in Louisiana who tested for the first time during 2005. Of this number, **1,736** were licensed; thereby, achieving an **88.1** percent pass rate for first time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana. This is the same as the national average of **88.1** percent.

INDIVIDUALS REVIEWED BY THE BOARD DUE TO CRIMINAL ARREST/CHARGES, ADDICTION, IMPAIRMENT OR PRIOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

GRADUATES:

There were **236** candidates testing who answered yes to prior criminal arrest/charges, drug or alcohol addiction, physical or mental impairment, and/or disciplinary action by another Board.

STUDENTS:

There were **3,470** students requesting approval from the Board to enter or continue in clinical nursing courses and **685** who were placed under investigation in 2006. Investigations were closed on **529** students. There were **2,444** students approved, **17** delayed and **29** denied.
