

## **Duties and Powers of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing**

The duties and powers of LSBN are defined in RS37:918. In order to assure that individuals licensed to practice as registered nurses and/or advanced practice registered nurses are qualified, LSBN is empowered to regulate nursing education and practice in Louisiana. Further, LSBN is charged with the responsibility to deny, revoke, suspend, probate, limit or otherwise discipline individuals who violate the provisions of the law governing nursing practice in Louisiana. The following sections reflect information regarding activities of LSBN in safeguarding the citizens of Louisiana in major areas: Nursing Education, Licensure, and Discipline/Alternative to Discipline.

Further, Senate Resolution 152 of the 2008 Regular Legislative Session requested the Louisiana State Board of Nursing establish a nursing workforce center in Louisiana. The charge to the nursing workforce center, hereafter called the Louisiana Center for Nursing, was identified as the following:

- Collect, analyze and report the registered nurse workforce data utilizing established nursing supply, demand, and predictor models to forecast registered nurse resource needs to the Louisiana Health Works Commission.
- Evaluate registered nurse education capacity, and develop strategies for increasing educational access, retention and mobility, including opportunity for minority and underrepresented groups.
- Establish a website for information concerning potential employment, and educational opportunities for becoming a registered nurse in Louisiana.

In 2012, the LSBN Board and staff held a strategic planning meeting and produced the LSBN 2013-2015 Strategic Map which identifies strategic priorities and strategic objectives that the Board will address over the next three years. In April 2013, LSBN revised the 2013-2015 Strategic Plan to include a strategic priority that specifically addresses nursing workforce.

**STRATEGIC PRIORITY B:** Streamline core operations to manage increasing volume.



#### **COMPLAINTS AND INVESTIGATIONS**

# Louisiana State Board of Nursing Agency-Wide Investigations and Disciplinary Actions for Calendar Year 2013

There were 2,055 individuals with complaints or alleged incidents that resulted in opened investigations and consideration for disciplinary action by LSBN for calendar year 2013. This represents an increase of three complaints when compared to 2012 (2,052). Of the 2,055 complaints or matters requiring further investigation by LSBN, 51.6% (1,060) were against RNs, 39.3% (808) were against student nurses, and 4.1% (84) were against Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) and Prescriptive Authority combined (Table 1). The percentage of complaints against all RNs, based on the 60,508 Active RNs licensed to practice in LA in 2013, is approximately 1.9% of the entire RN workforce, to include Registered Nurses, Endorsement Applicants, all APRN, RN Imposter and Prescriptive Authority. The two areas with the largest percentage increase in complaints was Registered Nurse Endorsement with 71% (+30) and Nurse Practitioner with a 72% increase (+28).

#### **Source of Opened Investigations**

As shown in Table 2, the source of over a third of the complaints to LSBN in 2013 was student files (student applications or application process). Self-reports from RNs was the second largest source of opened investigations (363). LSBN staff had 320 complaints reported and investigated by the Board. Approximately 78 (3.8%) complaints received by LSBN were initiated by

hospitals. Other sources include but are not limited to the Recovery Nurse Program, patient/family, other regulatory agencies, employers, nursing schools, and lay people.

## Types of Complaints or Potential Violations Resulting in Opened Investigations

More than half, 50.9% (1,046), of the 2,055 complaints or potential violations received by LSBN in 2013 for further investigation were 'criminal related'. Students accounted for the largest number of criminal related complaints with 571, followed by RNs with 475 (Table 3). Inability to practice safely (19.2%) came in second with 245 complaints against students and 150 against RNs. 'Other' complaints (228), which includes violations such as failure to comply with continuing education and/or failure to comply with a Board Order came in third. "Drug related" complaints constituted 2.1% (44), of the total complaints against RNs (41) and students (3) resulting in opened investigations.

## **Closed Investigations**

LSBN Staff closed 1,810 investigations during 2013. There were 888 closed by Board Staff other than an Investigator. This number accounts for the student clinical, student exam, and endorsement applications in which the applicant disclosed something that required documents to be sent in and reviewed prior to the application being approved. The Board Investigative Staff completed 922 investigations with 327 or 35% requiring action (Table 4) and 595 investigations were completed without action.

#### One Year Review of Louisiana State Board of Nursing Number of Investigations

The total number of investigations requiring disciplinary action increased by 15% (284 in 2012; 327 in 2013). Two types of complaints referred to the Hearings Department for disciplinary action showed significant change between 2012 and 2013. Criminal related complaints requiring action increased by 49% (154 in 2012; 230 in 2013). However, drug related requiring action decreased by 58% (57 in 2012; 24 in 2013). Every year RNs must renew their license between October 1 and January 31 of the following year. As part of the Renewal Application, RNs must answer various questions deemed to be related to their ability to practice nursing safely. Therefore, when reviewing the renewal questions for months of January 2013 and October through December 2013, 224 Renewal Applications were noted to have answers that needed to be reviewed. After reviewing the answers, LSBN staff screened out 28 Renewal Applications, resulting in 196 Renewal Investigations being opened. The 28 applications screened out were either already addressed by the LSBN Staff or in the process of being addressed by the LSBN Staff. This screening on the front end saved time, cost, duplication of work on the back end, and improved staff morale.

## **HEARING DEPARTMENT**

The Hearings Department is responsible for processing disciplinary actions against Registered Nurses and Student Nurses in Louisiana. After the Investigations Department completes the investigation, the information is turned over to the Hearings Department for drafting consent orders, filing charges, summary suspension and processing automatic suspensions and reinstatements. The Hearings Department processed 541 disciplinary actions during 2013. The 541 actions included Board Hearings, consent orders, confidential agreements and suspensions.

## RECOVERING NURSE PROGRAM/MONITORING

This division monitors registered nurses (RNs) and student nurses in the Recovering Nurse Program (RNP) through confidential agreements and disciplinary orders. The RNP was developed to protect the consumers of health care in Louisiana while allowing a RN recovering from chemical dependency and/or a medical, mental or physical condition to maintain licensure while being closely monitored by the Board through a structured agreement or order. Participants are allowed to join the program confidentially if they meet criteria outlined in L.R.S 3419 or through a consent order with probation if ineligible for confidential entry. After completion of treatment and clearance to return to work by the RNP staff and treatment team, the individual is allowed to practice in a highly supervised setting. Monitoring includes, but is not limited to, frequent random drug screenings, reports from employers, and participation in Aftercare and verified participation in support groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous.

In contrast to some independent alternative programs, the RNP is housed within Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN), therefore any non-compliance or relapse, once confirmed, is acted upon swiftly often resulting in either immediate return for treatment or automatic suspension of license. This close connection with LSBN offers greater protection to the citizens of Louisiana from potentially impaired practitioners.

The added structure and accountability of monitoring programs such as RNP have been linked to greater success in maintaining abstinence. Relapse rates for the general public following treatment for chemical dependency are 40%-60% (NIDA, 2009). The relapse rate for RNP participants at LSBN in 2013 was 11.1%.

**Relapse rate** was previously calculated by dividing the total number of relapsed participants for the year by the number of active confidential RNP participants as of the end of the year. The relapse rates for 2011 and 2012 were 9.5% and 9.8%, respectively. For 2013, relapse rates were calculated by dividing the number of relapses by the number of all active participants in the program as of December 31, 2013.

The Monitoring Division monitors compliance with Board orders/agreements (excluding RNP participants). These (non-RNP) individuals may have stipulations which are often similar to RNP such as drug screening and work site monitoring, but they are not required to do treatment and have not been diagnosed with chemical dependency. As of December 31, 2013, LSBN monitored a total of five-hundred and forty-two (542) registered nurses and student nurses compared to 582 in 2012 which represents a 6.9% decrease in the number of RNs and student nurses monitored by RNP (Table 8).

Additionally, the Monitoring Division processes disciplinary reinstatement requests for individuals previously disciplined by LSBN. The history of the individual is reviewed and stipulations for reinstatement are provided. There were 53 disciplinary reinstatements in 2013, with 107 requests. The Compliance Investigator formerly assigned to the Monitoring Division was reassigned to Investigations. The Director investigates the often complex histories of previously disciplined individuals to determine eligibility for reinstatement. Often times this requires a period of monitoring prior to eligibility for reinstatement. This also may include re-

entry into RNP. Some choose not to pursue reinstatement after stipulations are provided. Individuals with an extensive disciplinary history may be required to appear before a hearing with Board Members to determine suitability for reinstatement. The Monitoring Division investigates and prepares the cases for presentation at the Administrative Hearing.

Finally, the department drafts voluntary surrender agreements should an individual wish to surrender their license for a minimum of two (2) years rather than comply with the RNP agreement or board order. The department drafted twenty two (22) of these agreements in 2013.

#### **Departmental Highlights in 2013**

The RNP/Monitoring Department had several personnel changes in 2013 including the resignation of the Director and return of the former Director. A nurse was also added as a case manager for the Recovering Nurse Program.

In an effort to be fiscally responsible, the agency reviewed multiple contracts for drug screening programs and after a review of three companies an agreement was reached with First Lab. First Lab was already conducting drug screening for the Medical Board, and they have over 100 sites throughout the state. They also offered the participants an approximate 30% savings.

Two treatment facilities were removed from the LSBN Recognized Treatment Facility List for unacceptable relapse rates.

After institution of LAC Title 46: XLVII. 3331, LSBN has witnessed an increase in the number of applicants applying for licensure, reinstatement, and the right to practice as a student nurse with a prior serious criminal action and/or substance use disorder. Since the Board has a duty to exclude individuals who pose a risk to public safety, the rules will now deny applicants who have been convicted (or similar plea) to felony crimes of violence, sex offenses, and crimes involving the distribution, manufacture and production of drugs. Prior to the revision, grounds for permanent denial were only for crimes of violence and crimes involving the distribution of drugs. This rule also permanently denies applicants convicted of certain felony property crimes such as Medicaid Fraud and Identity Theft.

The second tier will deny applicants for a minimum of five years following the final disposition of the criminal case for any other felony convictions or for two or more misdemeanor crimes which reflect an inability to practice nursing safely. Additionally, applicants will be denied for a minimum of five years following a misdemeanor conviction and the existence of aggravating circumstances including but not limited to ongoing substance abuse.

Finally, the grounds for delay of an applicant have been increased to include recent diagnosis or treatment for substance use disorders. This will allow individuals to demonstrate rehabilitation prior to exposure of the challenges, temptations, and added stressors of nursing school and or employment as a newly licensed RN. This has resulted in a decrease in the number of students in RNP since they will be required to demonstrate rehabilitation prior to approval to enter clinical nursing courses. It has also resulted in an increase in the number of students delayed/denied to attend clinical nursing courses.

#### **LICENSURE**

## **Approval to Enroll in Clinical Nursing Courses**

There were 3,020 applications to enroll in clinical nursing courses during the calendar year of 2013 as compared to 2,471 in 2012 which represents a 22% increase. Of these, 810 were placed under investigations compared to 889 in 2012, a 9% decrease. A total of 3,217 student applications were approved for clinical enrollment, approval was delayed for 45 students, and 27 were denied.

## Completion of Louisiana Undergraduate Nursing Program

There were 2,274 graduates from 27 undergraduate nursing programs in Louisiana. Of this number, 26 (1%) were Diploma graduates, 999 (44%) were Associate Degree graduates, and 1,246 (55%) were Baccalaureate Degree graduates.

#### Licensure by Examination

Beginning January 1 through December 31, 2013 the NCLEX-RN examination was administered to 2,405 candidates using computerized adaptive testing (CAT). These candidates included first time takers, repeat takers, and foreign graduates. Of this number, 2,106 individuals were licensed to practice as registered nurses as initial licensure by examination.

Two thousand one hundred eighty-six (2,186) Louisiana graduates sat for the NCLEX-RN exam for the first time. Of this number, 1,902 passed the exam. First time candidates from nursing programs in Louisiana achieved a pass rate of 87.01% for the 2013 calendar year. The passage rate on the NCLEX-RN for graduates from Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs continues to exceed that of the nation in spite of the higher passing standard implemented in April 2013 by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). The increase in NCLEX-RN passing standards often resultu in an initial drop in passing rates followed by a rebound as programs adjust to the ney passing standards. Performance of first time candidates of nursing education programs in Louisiana can be found in Appendix A.

## Licensure by Examination Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

LSBN authorizes the practice of advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs) by examination in four categories, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA), Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM), Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS), and Nurse Practitioner (NP).

A total of 419 APRN licensure by examination applications were received during the year 2013. Of the applications received, a total 398 individuals were licensed to practice as APRNs: 71 as CRNAs, 1 as a CNM, 4 as CNSs, and 322 NPs. The remaining APRN by examination applications were not processed through licensure because their application was incomplete and/or expired.

## Licensure Renewals Registered Nurses/Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

A total of 56,973 RNs and 4,349 APRNs successfully renewed their licenses to practice nursing in Louisiana by the January 31, 2014 due date.

A total of 2,805 individuals relinquished the right to practice nursing in Louisiana, as follows: 2,185 RNs/APRNs failed to renew their license; 421 RNs and 32 APRNs requested inactive status; and 154 RNs and 13 APRNs requested retired status.

## **Licensure by Endorsement Registered Nurses**

As reflected in Table 9, a total of 1,705 RN endorsement applications to practice registered nursing in Louisiana were received during the year 2013. One thousand six hundred eighty (1,680) were received from United States (US) educated RNs and 25 were received from foreign educated RNs.

Of the endorsement applications received, a total of 1,234 individuals were licensed to practice as a RN, as follows: 1,212 US educated RNs and 22 foreign educated RNs. The remaining endorsement applications were not processed through licensure due to one of the following reasons: their application was incomplete and/or expired, or the RN completed a temporary nursing assignment and did not desire full licensure.

## Licensure by Endorsement Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

A total of 525 endorsement applications to practice as an APRN in Louisiana were received during the year 2013. All applications were received from United States (US) educated APRNs.

Of those endorsement applications received, a total 493 APRN applications were completed through licensure, as follows: 99 CRNAs, 3 CNM, 5 CNS, and 386 NPs. The remaining applications received in 2013 were not processed through licensure either because their application was incomplete and/or expired, or the APRN completed a temporary nursing assignment and did not desire full licensure.

## Licensure by Reinstatement Registered Nurses/Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

A total of 731 individuals reinstated their privilege to practice nursing in Louisiana during the year 2013: 706 RNs and 25 APRNs.

## Temporary Permits Issued Registered Nurses/Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

The total number of temporary permits issued for the year 2013 was 478, all to RNs, as follows: 450 endorsement permits and 28 disaster permits. Permits are utilized to allow the RN or APRN holding a valid and unencumbered RN or APRN license in another U.S. state to work as a RN or APRN in Louisiana until all documents are received in the LSBN office and full licensure can be issued. Additionally, permits may be issued to RNs and APRNs holding a valid and unencumbered RN or APRN license in another US state to work on a temporary basis within their respective scope of practice in Louisiana during special events or disasters.

## Verification of Credentials to Other States Registered Nurses/Advanced Practice Registered Nurses

During 2013, a total of 2,611 RNs utilized the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) verification service (<u>NurSys.com</u>) to request their Louisiana RN credentials be verified to another state board of nursing. Table 10 reflects the number of individuals requesting licensure verifications per year for the previous 5 year period.

## Prescriptive Authority Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Only

Prior to delivering health care services in the state of Louisiana, an APRN who engages in diagnosis and management must apply for and receive approval from LSBN for prescriptive authority privileges. Said prescriptive authority privileges must be in collaboration with one or more physicians or dentists. Table 11 reflects the number of APRNs with prescriptive and distributing authority in compliance with the Board's rules as of January 31, 2014.

## 2014 ANNUAL REPORT LICENSEES WITH DEFAULTED STUDENT LOANS

In accordance with Louisiana Revised Statute 38:2951, the LSBN did not allow 83 RNs who were deemed by Sallie Mae on behalf of the Louisiana Student Financial Assistance Commission (LSFAC) to be in default of a student loan. This represents a decrease of approximately 42% from the 143 nurses that were in loan default last year. The number of loan defaults reported to LSBN annually by Sallie Mae (on behalf of LSFAC) is anticipated to continue to decrease over the next 10 to 15 years. LOSFA (Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance) was the State agency designated to be the 'guarantor' of student loans that originated in Louisiana under the 'Federal Family Education Loan Program' (FFELP) for loans disbursed prior to July 1, 2010. New loans are issued under the 'William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program' in which the U.S. Department of Education is the lender.

Of the 83 total nurses in default during 2013, approximately 36%, or 30 nurses, had been in loan default previously as outlined below:

- $\triangleright$  Default 6 times = 2 nurses
- ➤ Default 5 times = 3 nurses
- ➤ Default 4 times = 2 nurses
- ➤ Default 3 times = 9 nurses
- ➤ Default 2 times = 14 nurses

The remaining 53 nurses were in loan default for the first time. This represents approximately 64% of the total 83 nurses for this year.

Certified letters were mailed to the RNs on September 24, 2013 advising them that their ability to renew their 2014 RN license would be placed on hold until the LSBN received authorization from Sallie Mae that the loan was removed from default status.

As of February 1, 2014, 79 of the 83 nurses had been removed from default status by Sallie Mae and permitted to seek licensure renewal by January 31, 2014. Of the remaining 4, 2 contacted the Board to advise they were living and working out-of-state and choose to go inactive, 1 nurse was suspended for other cause, and the license for the remaining 1 nurse was changed to delinquent status and unable to practice as a registered nurse in Louisiana.

## 2014 ANNUAL REPORT RELICENSURE/RENEWAL CONTINUING EDUCATION AUDIT

In accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.3335.I.2, the LSBN performed an audit on the nursing continuing education (CE) requirements for 2013 license renewal on 1,419 RNs.

A random selection of RNs renewing their license during the 2013 licensure renewal process was conducted which yielded a total of 1,419 RNs (2.5% of the 56,973 RNs renewing their license by January 31, 2014). One thousand one hundred seventy-four (1,174) were compliant and had met the CE requirements. The remaining 245 RNs were deemed non-compliant and action was taken as outlined below:

- ➤ Two hundred thirty-nine (239) RNs obtained additional CE, produced documentation to support completion, and were issued Informal Reprimands for first time non-compliance;
- Two (2) RNs changed their status to inactive as they were no longer working in nursing or had moved out of state;
- > Two (2) RNs were reported to the Board by family as deceased;
- ➤ One (1) RN was placed under investigation for submitting CE documentation to the Board that reflected the number of contact hours awarded had been altered. The nurse's license was inactivated, the RN signed a consent order and was issued a formal reprimand with fine and stipulations for license reinstatement;
- ➤ One (1) RN was suspended for other (non-audit) cause.

In accordance with LAC 46:XLVII.4513.D.5, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing performed an audit on the continuing competency for prescriptive authority for 2013 license renewal on 58 APRNs. Letters were mailed to the APRNs advising them of their selection to participate in the random audit of additional 6 hours of pharmacology CE needed for their prescriptive authority privileges. Of the 58 APRNs selected, 52 were compliant. The remaining 6 APRNs obtained additional CE's, produced documentation to support completion, and were issued Informal Reprimands for first time noncompliance.

# LOUISIANA CENTER FOR NURSING 2013 INITIATIVES

#### 2012 Nursing Education Capacity and Supply Report

The 2012 Louisiana State Board of Nursing Annual Report and the 2012 Nursing Education Capacity and Supply Report (a subset of the LSBN Annual Report) are used to inform the Governor, Members of the Legislature, other state agencies, the health care community, academic institutions, and the citizens of Louisiana about the work that is being done by Board Members and Staff to safeguard the life and health of the citizens of Louisiana by assuring persons practicing as registered nurses and advanced practice registered nurses are competent and safe, and share information about Louisiana's RN workforce and nursing education capacity. The 2012 LSBN Annual Report was compiled in 2013 and is based on data collected in the previous year (2012). The annual report in its entirety is available on the LSBN website.

# Revised LSBN Strategic Map to Include the Strategic Priority and Strategic Objectives for the Louisiana Center for Nursing

During the March 27<sup>th</sup> Strategic Planning Meeting, it was decided by the Board that the LSBN Strategic Map (2013-2015) be revised to reflect the inclusion of nursing workforce issues which are an integral part of the Board through the work of the Louisiana Center for Nursing. Thus, Strategic Priority E was added to the current strategic map which reflects the work of the Louisiana Center for Nursing:

- o Strategic Priority: Advance nursing workforce through research.
- o Strategic Objectives:
  - Collect, analyze and report RN workforce data
  - Develop a nursing workforce forecasting model for Louisiana
  - Contribute to nursing workforce policy development
  - Develop and support new and existing nursing workforce initiatives
  - Work with key stakeholders to address critical nursing workforce issues

#### Louisiana's Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Models

The Louisiana Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Model is a unique approach to predicting the supply and demand for all levels of licensed professional nursing workforce including registered nurses (RNs), advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs), and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) through 2020. There are 27 separate models (RN, APRN, and LPN) covering eight regional labor market areas with one state model of aggregated data for each level of nursing workforce. The Northeast Ohio Nursing Initiative (NEONI) Forecasting Model which is based on the HRSA model was used as a template for Louisiana's Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Model. The model can be used as a policy tool that can help identify the most effective way to manage any anticipated shortages in the availability of nurses. This project was funded by the Louisiana Health Works Commission and the Louisiana State Board of Nursing. In 2013, the model was presented to the Health Works Commission, the Louisiana State Board of Nursing, the Louisiana Council of Administrators of Nursing Education, and the LAC Acadiana Nursing Forum in Lafayette.

- Continue to present the Forecasting Model across the state to stakeholders
- Update the Forecasting Model with the 2013 Supply/Education/Demographic Data for RNs, APRNs, and LPNs
- Repeat the Nurse Employer/Demand Study for RNs, LPNs, and CNAs –
   Approved by the Board of Nursing at the December 2013 Board Meeting
- Develop Regional Nursing Supply and Demand Profiles for the eight Regional Labor Market Areas in Louisiana

# Proposal Submitted to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing Center for Regulatory Excellence

The Center for Nursing submitted a proposal to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Center for Regulatory Excellence on October 4, 2013. The specific aims for the proposal were based on recommendations based on findings from the Louisiana Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Model which were to: 1) develop comprehensive regional profiles of the current supply, demand, and education capacity for RNs, APRNs, and LPNs for the eight regional labor market areas in Louisiana; 2) update the Louisiana Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Model with the 2014 licensure renewal data; 3) validate and modify the assumptions in the Forecasting Model based on the findings obtained from the regional analysis of the 2013-2014 nursing supply, education capacity, demand, and new graduate data; 4) predict nursing supply and demand through 2020 at the regional and statewide level using the updated model; 5) use Geographic Information System (GIS) Mapping to visually illustrate regional and state-wide profiles, and 6) develop recommendations for workforce development and strategic planning for each region and the state as a whole based on 'what if' scenarios generated by the Louisiana Multi-Regional Statewide Nursing Workforce Forecasting Model. The Center for Nursing was notified on November 1<sup>st</sup> that the proposal was not funded. Although the reviewers felt that it was a strong proposal and that it was well written, but it was specific to Louisiana and they could not see how it would impact other states.

# 2013 Newly Licensed Registered Nurses Survey

Louisiana's second New RN (Graduate) Survey was launched on September 5, 2013. The purpose of the survey was to monitor trends in hiring practices experienced by newly licensed RNs as changes occur in the state's health care system, economy, and nursing workforce, in order to better inform policy makers, schools of nursing, prospective nursing students, and other interested stakeholders. The final report will be published in 2014.

#### The National Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers

The Louisiana Center for Nursing is a subscriber member of The National Forum for State Nursing Workforce Centers. Dr. Bienemy is a member of the Forum's Research Committee. The Forum is responsible for developing the Nursing Education Capacity, Nursing Supply, and Nursing Demand Minimum Data Set which is used by many organizations across the country that collect data on the nursing workforce. Dr. Bienemy was one of the co-authors for an article entitled 'Toward Standardization (Part 2): National Nursing Minimum Data Sets Consensus Building and Implementation Status' that was published in *Policy, Politics, & Nursing Practice* in December, 2012. Most recently, The Forum partnered with the National Council of State Boards of Nursing to conduct the 2013 National

Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses which was published in the July 2013 issue of the *Journal of Nursing Regulation*.

# Louisiana Action Coalition (LAC) – Future of Nursing Campaign for Action

In February 2013, the Louisiana Action Coalition was granted the RWJF State Implementation Program Grant in the amount of \$150,000.00 (\$75,000.00 per year). These funds served as the matching funds for the \$150,000.00 Rapides Foundation Challenge Grant. As the fiscal agent for LAC and applicant on the grant, The Rapides Foundation was named the Awardee on the grant. The objectives of the grant are centered on improving collection and analysis of nursing-workforce data in Louisiana, overcoming barriers to the work of advanced practice registered nurses, and developing a sustainable infrastructure for the Louisiana Action Coalition.

- o Ms. Ann Jenkins was hired as the Coordinator for LAC. Ms. Jenkins has a background in communications, and public relations.
- Dr. Susan Hassmiller visited Louisiana on April 30<sup>th</sup>. Two activities were planned for her visit: a luncheon meeting with potential funders at the Baptist Community Ministries Foundation in New Orleans and a videotaping of an interview which was focused on Leadership in Nursing. Representatives from Baptist Community Ministries, The Greater New Orleans Foundation, New Orleans Works (NOW), Louisiana Public Health Institute, Blue Cross Blue Shield Foundation, AARP, and the McFarland Institute attended the luncheon. - O The first of five LAC sponsored Nursing Forums to be held across the state took place in Lafayette at the Picard Center on November 21<sup>st</sup> from 3:00 PM to 8:00 PM. The purpose of the Forums is to inform the nursing community about the recommendations from the Institute of Medicine Report on the Future of Nursing, the Future of Nursing Campaign for Action, and the Louisiana Action Coalition. Senator Fred Mills participated in the panel discussion. Dr. Bienemy presented the Forecasting Model and shared information about how Louisiana's nursing workforce aligns with the recommendations from the IOM Report on the Future of Nursing.

#### **NURSING EDUCATION CAPACITY IN LOUISIANA 2012-2013**

It is the charge of the Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) to closely monitor all nursing programs in the state that prepare nursing students for initial licensure as a registered nurse (RN), as well as those graduate programs that prepare RNs as advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs). It is the responsibility of LSBN to ensure that these programs are preparing safe and effective practitioners to care for the citizens of Louisiana. Deans and Directors of Pre-RN Licensure programs in Louisiana must submit an annual report to LSBN in the fall of each year to demonstrate ongoing compliance with all rules and regulations relative to nursing education. Information such as the number of applicants accepted into the programs each year, the number of students enrolled in clinical nursing courses, the number of graduates, and the qualifications of faculty teaching in the programs is used to determine RN education capacity. An analysis of the data obtained from the 2012-2013 annual reports submitted by undergraduate and graduate nursing programs in Louisiana was used to develop the 2013 Nursing Education Capacity Report.

#### Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

LSBN approved twenty-seven (27) pre-RN licensure programs during the 2012-2013 report year (Table 12): One (1) diploma program, twelve (12) associate degree (AD) programs, and fourteen (14) baccalaureate in nursing (BSN) programs that prepare students to become candidates for initial RN licensure in Louisiana (see Appendix A for a List of LSBN Approved Nursing Education Programs). Our Lady of the Lake College is in the process of phasing out its AD program and will be graduating the last class in 2014. William Carey is in the process of phasing out its BSN program in Louisiana and will graduate its last class in 2014.

#### Applicants and Admissions to Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

The pool of qualified applicants applying to pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana in 2012-2013 increased by 3% over the last year compared to a 3% decrease in 2011-2012 (Table 13). This represents the first increase in the number of qualified applicants applying to Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs since 2009. There was a 7% decrease between 2009 and 2012 in the number of qualified applicants applying to pre-RN licensure programs - dropping from 4,898 in 2009 to a low of 4,544 in 2012, although there was a 3% increase noted between 2012 and 2013. In the current report year, 62% (2,904) of the 4,661 qualified applicants were admitted to Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs, in comparison to 66% that were admitted in 2011-2012. Approximately 38% of qualified applicants were denied admission to Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs in 2012-2013 compared to 34% in 2012 (see Appendix B2 for a summary report of applicants and admissions to pre-RN Licensure programs and Appendix B3 for a breakdown of applicants and admissions by programs).

# Applicants and Admissions to Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana by Program Type for the 2012-2013 Annual Report Year

As seen in Table 13a, more students continue to apply to BSN programs (2,506) when compared to AD programs (2,085). The number of qualified students applying to BSN programs decreased by 1% (2,472 in 2012), while the number of qualified students applying to AD programs decreased by 4% (1,985 in 2012) when compared to the previous year. Seventy percent (70%) of the qualified applicants applying to BSN programs, 55% of those applying to AD programs, and 57% of those applying to the Diploma program were admitted. Sixty-three percent (63%) of the 2,904 qualified applicants admitted to pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were admitted to BSN programs, 36% to AD programs, and 1% to diploma programs.

# Reasons Why Qualified Applicants are not Admitted to Pre-RN Licensure Programs (2012-2013 Annual Report Year)

A lack of budgeted faculty positions remains the number one reason identified by Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs as to why qualified applicants were not admitted during the 2012-2013 report year (Table 14). The lack of available qualified faculty and faculty salaries that are not competitive tied for second place. The lack of available classroom space came in third, followed by the lack of clinical placement sites.

# **Enrollment in Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana**

In the current report year, 14,050 students enrolled in post-secondary education settings in Louisiana declared nursing as their major (Table 15), which reflects a 6% increase from the previous report year (13,245 in 2012). However, there was a 7% decrease in the number of students enrolled in clinical nursing courses in 2012-2013 (see Appendix B2 for a summary report on enrollments in pre-RN Licensure programs).

#### Gender of Students Enrolled in Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

There was a 15% decrease in the number of males enrolled in Pre-RN licensure programs in 2013 compared to an 11% increase in the number of male students in the previous report year (Table 16). Females represented 86% of students enrolled in pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana in 2013 (85% in 2012), while males represented 14% (15% in 2012). Overall, the number of male and female students enrolled in clinical courses has decreased over the past 5 years.

## Racial Distribution of Students Enrolled in Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

In 2013, 66% of the students enrolled in pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were White, 25% were Black, 3% Hispanic, 2% Asian, and 4% Other (Table 17). There was an 18% decrease in the number of Asians enrolled, a 16% decrease in the number of Hispanics, and an 11% decrease in the number of Blacks enrolled when compared to the previous year. Of the 249 students that reported their ethnicity as *Other*, 28 were self-reported as Native American/Alaskan Natives.

#### Age of Students enrolled in Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

The majority (43%) of the students enrolled in pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana in the current report year were between 21 and 25 years of age. The youngest group of students (17-20 years old) represented 16% of the student population, and the 26 to 40 year age group was represented by 33% of the student population (Table 18).

# Prior Education Status of Students Enrolled in Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana (2010-2013)

Between 2012 and 2013 there was an 8% increase in the number of LPNs enrolled in clinical nursing courses in Pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana (Table 19). Yet, between 2009 and 2013 the number of LPNs enrolled in clinical nursing courses declined by 14%. Since 2009, there has been a 137%

increase in the number of students enrolled in pre-RN licensure programs with prior education in other health fields. During the same time period (2009-2013), the number of students possessing degrees in fields outside of healthcare that were enrolled in clinical courses in Pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana decreased by 4% (see Appendix B7 for the 2012-2013 report by Individual Schools of Nursing).

# Graduates from Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

When compared to the previous report year, the number of graduates from Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs remained somewhat stagnant with only a small decrease in number by 7 graduates. Fifty-five percent of the 2,274 graduates in the 2012-2013 report year were from baccalaureate programs, 44% from associate degree programs, and 1% from the one diploma program in the state (Table 20). There was a 4% increase in the number of graduates from BSN programs, compared to a 5% decrease in the number from AD programs, and a 6% decrease from the diploma program (see Appendix B2 for a summary report of RN graduates and Appendix B8 for the number of RN Graduates per program for 2013).

# Non-Traditional Graduates from Louisiana's Pre-RN Licensure Programs

The number of licensed practical nurses graduating from Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs has increased over the past 4 years (Table 21). There was a 12% increase in the number of LPNs graduating from AD programs and a 41% increase in the number graduating from BSN programs between 2010 and 2013. There has been a decrease in the number of students graduating from accelerated nursing programs in Louisiana with the most significant decrease being graduates from Accelerated AD programs.

#### Pre-RN Licensure Students in Louisiana Performance on the NCLEX-RN

In 2013 there were a total of 2,186 RN candidates (2,242 in 2012) sitting for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) exam with 1,902 (87.01%) passing on the first take (Table 22). The overall national passage rate on the NCLEX-RN for 2013 was 83.04% compared to 90.34% in 2012 (see Appendix B1 for NCLEX-RN results by program).

The passage rate on the NCLEX-RN for graduates from Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs continues to exceed that of the nation (Table 23) in spite of the higher passing standard implemented in April 2013 by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). There was a decrease in the number of students sitting for the exam compared to 2012 (2,242) as well as the number passing the exam for each program type in 2012-2013. A total of 28 graduates from the Diploma program passed the NCLEX-RN exam with a 100% passage rate.

To gauge the current level of demand for nurse faculty, data was obtained from the 2012-2013 Annual Reports submitted to LSBN by the Deans and Directors of pre-RN licensure programs and APRN programs in the state of Louisiana. Deans and Directors were asked to report the number of filled and vacant faculty positions in their pre-RN licensure programs as of October 15, 2013. These numbers are depicted by program type and full vs. part-time positions in Table 24.

There were a total of 511 budgeted full-time nurse faculty positions reported by Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs in 2013 compared to 526 in 2012 which reflects a 3% decrease from the previous year. Nursing faculty positions were filled with 511 full-time and 225 part-time faculty members, a total of 736 faculty compared to a total of 727 in 2012. Thirty-five (35) faculty positions were funded from grants, capitation funds, additional appointments, and/or other funding sources compared to 24 positions in 2012, which represents a 46% increase in the number of faculty positions funded by other sources.

#### **Vacant Nurse Faculty Positions**

There were a total of 27 vacant nurse faculty positions reported by Deans and Directors in the current report year, compared to 26 in the previous report year (Table 25). Eighteen (18) vacant nurse faculty positions were reported by Louisiana's BSN programs and 9 by AD programs. The number of vacant full-time faculty positions will often determine the number of part-time positions needed. Many schools do not budget positions for part-time instructors, instead they are hired as needed.

## New Nurse Faculty Appointments, Exceptions and use of Preceptors

A total of 84 new faculty appointments were reported by pre-RN licensure programs during the 2012-2013 report compared to 85 in the previous year (Table 26). Sixty-three percent (63%) of the new faculty appointments were for BSN programs and 35% were for AD programs. There were two new faculty appointments for the diploma program.

Faculty exceptions are granted to pre-RN licensure programs upon approval of the Board for a pre-approved time period. According to LSBN Rules and Regulations, Title 46, Part XLVII, Chapter 35, No. 3515 B.8, the number of faculty exceptions shall not exceed 20 percent of the number of full-time nurse faculty employed (not FTE) in the program. The need for faculty exceptions is indicative of the lack of available qualified nurse faculty. The number of faculty exceptions requested by pre-RN licensure programs went from 35 in 2012 to 46 in 2013 which represents a 31% increase in the number of faculty exceptions utilized by pre-RN licensure programs over the last year.

Preceptors are valuable resources in nursing education. Preceptors are used only during the last two academic semesters of a baccalaureate program and during one of the last two semesters of a diploma or associate degree program (LSBN Rules and Regulations, Title 46, XLVII, Chapter 35, No.3541B). In preceptor-student relationships, nursing faculty retain the responsibility for selecting, guiding, and evaluating student learning experiences with input from the preceptor.

In the 2012-2013 report year, there were a total of 1,153 preceptors used by pre-RN licensure programs, compared to 1,215 in 2012 which reflects a 5% decrease in the number of preceptors used by pre-RN licensure programs over the last year.

# **Nursing Faculty Attrition**

Faculty attrition due to faculty leave, resignation, retirement, death or termination contributes to an ongoing demand for nurse faculty (Table 27). In 2012-2013 a total of 10 faculty went on leave (12 in 2011-2012). There were a total of 47 resignations in 2012-2013 (no change from the previous year), 20 retirements (19 in 2011-2012), and 15 terminations (17 in 2011-2012), and one death.

# **Educational Preparation of Nurse Faculty**

The Institute of Medicine Report on the Future of Nursing: *Leading Change, Advancing Health* recommends that the proportion of nurses with a BSN be increased to 80% and the number of nurses with a doctorate be doubled by 2020 (IOM Report, 2011). According to the Carnegie Study (Benner, Sutphen, Leonard and Day, 2009), in order to meet the projected shortages for registered nurses, nursing education programs must increase their capacity by approximately 90%. The educational preparation of nursing faculty is essential. In order to properly educate the next generation of RNs, nurse faculty must be prepared to teach nursing students how to care for clients with complex diagnoses and treatment plans; be familiar with essential principles of teaching and learning; be able to appropriately use the newest teaching learning healthcare technology; and have the ability to engage nursing students in the teaching-learning process.

The Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), require that at least 25% of nursing course hours in a Baccalaureate Nursing program be taught by faculty members holding the terminal degree (2012). In 2012-2013 approximately 17% (146) of the faculty teaching in pre-RN licensure programs were prepared at the doctoral level, 78% (687) were Masters prepared, and 5% (46) reported that their highest degree in nursing was a baccalaureate degree (Table 28). This represents a 2% increase in the number of faculty prepared at the doctoral level (15% increase in 2011-2012), a 2% decrease in those prepared at the Masters' level (80% in 2011-2012), and no change in the percentage of faculty prepared at the BSN level.

There was an increase in the number of doctoral prepared faculty teaching in pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana in 2012-2013 for all forms of doctorates except PhD in related field (Table 29). It is interesting to note that there was a 47% increase in the number of faculty with a DNP and a 33% increase in the number with a PhD in nursing.

# **Board of Regents Nursing Faculty Stipends**

According to the 2012-2013 annual reports from pre-RN licensure programs, 113 nurse faculty employed by pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were recipients of the Board of Regents (BOR) Nursing Faculty Stipends which represents an increase of 13 nurse faculty when compared to the 2011-2012 report year (Table 30). One faculty member pursuing a Master's degree was funded by the BOR Nurse Faculty Stipend program in 2012-2013.

# **Nurse Faculty Salaries**

Noncompetitive salaries for nursing faculty has been consistently cited as one of the top four reasons why hundreds of qualified students are not admitted to Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs each year. Noncompetitive salaries leads to an inadequate number of filled nurse faculty positions which is cited as a major reason for denying admission to qualified students (National Advisory Council on Nurse Education and Practice, 2010). According to the American Association of Colleges of Nursing (AACN, 2012), the average salary of an NP, across settings and specialties, is \$94,050 compared to \$80,690 for a Master's prepared faculty. The higher compensation in clinical and private-sector settings is luring current and potential nurse educators away from teaching (AACN, 2009). Joynt and Kimball (2008), authors of a white paper entitled *Blowing Open the Bottleneck: Designing New Approaches to Increase Nurse Education Capacity* stated "While nursing faculty compensation adjustments alone will not solve the nursing education capacity problem, the value of the educators must be acknowledged and rewarded in order to move forward" (p.12).

The Deans and Directors of pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana reported the average salaries of nursing faculty according to the rankings of instructor, assistant professor, associate professor, and professor. The Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) mean salary for full-time instructional faculty teaching in nursing programs in four year colleges or universities in is \$105,376 for Professors, \$74,914 for Associate Professors, \$63,694 for Assistant Professors and \$45,322 for Instructors (2013). Although there was an increase in 2012-2013 in mean salaries for assistant professors, associate professors, and professors, mean faculty salaries for all level of nursing faculty in Louisiana remain below the SREB mean for four year public colleges (Table 31).

#### **Nurse Faculty in Louisiana Demographics**

#### Age

When planning for a projected nursing shortage, issues related to an aging nurse faculty must be addressed. The literature contends that younger nurses tend to choose practice roles over faculty roles (Joynt, and Kimball, 2008). In 2012-2013 over half (53%) of the nurse faculty in Louisiana were 51 and older (Table 32). The average age of nurse faculty at retirement is approximately 62.5 according to a report published by AACN (2014). A wave of retirements is expected within the next 10 years among faculty teaching in nursing programs across the country (AACN, 2014). One hundred and fifty (150) faculty currently teaching in Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs are 61+ years, which represents a 42% increase from the previous year.

# Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) Education in Louisiana

There are seven Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana offering a degree as an advanced practice registered nurse (APRN). Six of the seven programs offer the Nurse Practitioner (NP) role; four the Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) role; and two the Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) role (see Appendix A for a list of LSBN Approved Graduate Nursing Programs). There are currently no programs offering the Certified Nurse Midwife (CNM) role in Louisiana (Table 35).

#### Admission to APRN Programs in Louisiana

In the 2012-2013 report year, there was an 11% increase in the number of students admitted to APRN programs in Louisiana when compared to the previous report year. There was a 15% increase in NP program admissions and a 7% decrease in admissions to Louisiana's CRNA programs (Table 36). No change was noted from the previous report year in terms of the number of students admitted to CNS programs which remains relatively low. It is important to note that the numbers that are addressed in the annual report do not include RNs living and working in Louisiana that have been admitted to APRN programs in other states.

# **Enrollment in APRN Programs in Louisiana**

Over the past year there was an overall 7% increase in the number of students enrolled in Louisiana's APRN programs. Although this increase is important, it is not as significant an increase when compared to the 26% increase between 2011 and 2012 (Table 37). There was a 15% increase in enrollment in NP programs over the past year and a 62% increase in enrollment since 2009. In contrast, there was a 27% decrease in the number enrolled in CRNA programs when compared to a 25% increase in the previous year.

#### Age of Students enrolled in APRN Programs in Louisiana

# **Graduates from APRN Programs in Louisiana**

In the 2012-2013 report year, there were a total of 323 graduates from Louisiana's APRN programs (Table 41) which represents a 5% increase when compared to the 307 graduates in the previous report year (2011-2012). The majority of the graduates were from NP programs (79%) and CRNA programs (20%), although there was a 7% decrease in the number of graduates from CRNA programs over the last year. CNS programs produced 2% (5) of the graduates from APRN programs.

#### **Performance of APRN Graduates on Certification Exams**

Certification examinations taken by graduates from Louisiana's APRN programs include, but are not limited to, the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP), the Council on Certification for Nurse Anesthetists (CCNA), the National Certification Corporation (NCC), the Pediatric Nursing Certification Board (PNCB), and the American Association of Critical Care Nurses (AACCN). In 2012-2013, 274 APRN candidates sat for their respective certification exams. Two hundred and sixty-six (266) candidates successfully passed their certification exams resulting in a 97.08% passage rate for the state in the 2012-2013 report year (Table 42).

# **Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana Offering Non-Licensure Degrees in Nursing Education and Nursing Administration**

Six of the seven Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana offer a Master's Degree in Nursing Education and/or a Master's Degree in Nursing Administration (Table 43). Currently, LSBN only has jurisdiction over graduate nursing programs that lead to the APRN degree which require licensure and not those that lead to a Master's in Nursing Education or Nursing Administration. In order to better inform policy makers about nursing workforce demand and to be able to predict future nursing workforce needs, it is important to identify how many nurses are being prepared to take on faculty positions in Louisiana, as well as leadership positions in hospitals and other health care settings. A major limitation related to reporting on enrollment of Louisiana's RNs in APRN and non-licensure Graduate Nursing programs is the inability to track those nurses that are enrolled in online or out-of-state programs that do not come under the jurisdiction of the Board of Nursing.

# Admission to Non-Licensure Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana in 2012-2013

In the 2012-2013 report year, 260 RN students were admitted to Louisiana's non-licensure graduate programs in Nursing Education and Nursing Administration (Table 44) which represents a 15% increase in number when compared to the previous report year. The majority of the students (253; 97%) were admitted to Nursing Administration programs across the state which represents an 18% increase when compared to 2011-2012. Nursing Education programs admitted 7 graduate nursing students during the 2012-2013 report year compared to 11 in the previous year, which represents a 36% decrease in the number of students selecting nursing education as a focus of study. Of the 813 students admitted to graduate nursing programs across the state, 553 (68%) were admitted to APRN programs, 253 (31%) were admitted to Nursing Administration programs, and 7 (0.9%) were admitted to Nursing Education programs in 2012-2013.

# **Enrollment in Non-Licensure Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana**

In the 2012-2013 report year, a total of 460 RN students were enrolled in Louisiana's non-licensure graduate programs in Nursing Education and Nursing Administration (Table 45). The majority of the students (434) were enrolled in Nursing Administration programs across the state. There were 26 RN students enrolled in the state's Nursing Education programs during the 2012-2013 report year, which represents a 41% decrease from the previous year and a 63% decrease since 2010. Of the 1,648 students enrolled in graduate nursing programs across the state, 1,188 (72%) were enrolled in APRN programs, 434 (26%) were enrolled in Nursing Administration programs, and 26 (2%) were enrolled in Nursing Education programs during the 2012-2013 report year.

# Age of Students enrolled in Non-Licensure Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana

Information about the age of students enrolled in non-licensure programs in Louisiana was solicited for the first time on the 2011-2012 LSBN Annual Report. Almost a third (31%) of the students enrolled in Louisiana's non-licensure graduate nursing programs were between 31 and 40 years of age, 34% were between 41 and 50 years, and 22% were 51 and older (Table 48). Only thirteen percent (13%) of the students enrolled in non-licensure programs were 30 years of age and younger.

# Graduates from Non-Licensure Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana

# Nurse Faculty Teaching in Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana

# **Educational Preparation of Nursing Faculty Teaching in Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana**

Faculty teaching in Graduate Nursing programs in Louisiana must have a minimum of a Master's Degree in Nursing (LSBN Rules and Regulations Title 46 Part XLVII Chapter 45, 4509 G 2.c) although most accrediting bodies prefer that graduate nursing faculty have a doctorate either in nursing or in a related field outside of nursing. Seventy-two percent (72%) of the faculty teaching in Louisiana's graduate nursing programs held an earned doctorate in the current report year compared to 76% in 2011-2012 (Table 50). A Masters was the highest degree held by 28% of the 190 faculty teaching in graduate nursing programs in Louisiana in 2012-2013. These individuals possessed credentials and/or expertise in an advanced practice specialty area that was recognized by both LSBN and national accrediting bodies.

# Filled and Vacant Nurse Faculty Positions in Graduate Nursing Programs in Louisiana

Deans and Directors of Louisiana's graduate nursing programs were asked to submit the number of budgeted full-time faculty positions that were filled as of October 15, 2013. There were 114 filled full-time nurse faculty positions reported statewide which reflects a 30% increase in the number of filled nurse faculty positions in Louisiana's graduate nursing programs compared to the previous year (88 filled positions in 2011-2012). A total of 190 full-time and part-time faculty filled these positions which represents a 15% increase from the previous report year (Table 51). Thirteen faculty positions were reported as being vacant (9 in 2011-2012). There was also a 4% decrease in the number of faculty positions funded from other sources (e.g., grants, capitation funds) when compared to the previous report year.

# NURSING EDUCATION CAPACITY IN LOUISIANA MAJOR FINDINGS 2012-2013

### Pre-RN Licensure Programs in Louisiana

#### **Pre-RN Licensure Students**

- There was a 7% decrease between 2009 and 2012 in the number of qualified applicants applying to pre-RN licensure programs dropping from 4,898 in 2009 to a low of 4,544 in 2012, although there was a 3% increase noted between 2012 and 2013.
- In the current report year, over one-third (38%) of the 4,661 qualified applicants to Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs were not admitted, in comparison to 34% that were not admitted in 2011-2012.
- Fifty-four percent (2,506) of the qualified applicants applied to BSN programs, 45% (2,506) applied to AD programs and 2% (70) applied to the Diploma program in 2012-2013.
- Sixty-three percent (63%) of the 2,904 qualified applicants admitted to pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were admitted to BSN programs, 36% to AD programs, and 1% to diploma programs.
- A lack of budgeted faculty positions remains the number one reason identified by Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs as to why qualified applicants were not admitted during the 2012-2013 report year. The lack of available qualified faculty and faculty salaries that are not competitive tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> place0
- Over the last five years (2009-2013) there has been a 5% increase in the number of students admitted to BSN programs, a 32% decrease in the number admitted to AD programs, and a 2% decrease in the number of students admitted to the diploma program in Louisiana0
- There was a 7% decrease in the number of students enrolled in clinical nursing courses in 2012-20130
- There was a 15% decrease in the number of males enrolled in Pre-RN licensure programs in 2013 compared to an 11% increase in the number of male students in the previous report year0
- Between 2012 and 2013 there was an 8% increase in the number of LPNs enrolled in clinical nursing courses in Pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana.
- In 2013, 66% (3,797) of the students enrolled in pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were White, 25% were Black, 3% Hispanic, 2% Asian, and 4% Other. There was an 18% decrease in the number of Asians enrolled, a 16% decrease in the number of Hispanics, and an 11% decrease in the number of Blacks enrolled when compared to the previous year0
- Fifty-five percent of the 2,274 graduates in the 2012-2013 report year were from baccalaureate programs, 44% from associate degree programs, and 1% from the one diploma program in the state0
- There was a 12% increase in the number of LPNs graduating from AD programs and a 41% increase in the number graduating from BSN programs between 2010 and 2013.
- The passage rate on the NCLEX-RN for graduates from Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs continues to exceed that of the nation in spite of the higher passing standard implemented in April 2013 by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN).

#### **Faculty Teaching in Pre-RN Licensure Programs**

• Thirty-five (35) faculty positions were funded from grants, capitation funds, additional appointments, and/or other funding sources during the current report year compared to 24

- positions in 2012, which represents a 46% increase in the number of faculty positions funded by other sources.
- There was a 47% increase in the number of faculty with a DNP degree and a 33% increase in the number with a PhD in nursing teaching in Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs.
- According to the 2012-2013 annual reports from pre-RN licensure programs, 113 nurse faculty employed by pre-RN licensure programs in Louisiana were recipients of the Board of Regents (BOR) Nursing Faculty Stipends which represents an increase of 13 nurse faculty when compared to the 2011-2012 report year0
- Mean salaries for all level of nursing faculty teaching in Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs continue to fall below the SREB mean for four year public colleges0
- In 2012-2013 over half (53%) of the nurse faculty in Louisiana were 51 and older0
- One hundred and fifty (150) faculty currently teaching in Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs are 61+ years, which represents a 42% increase from the previous year0
- A little over 70% of the faculty teaching in Louisiana's pre-RN licensure programs are White. Twenty eight percent of the faculty are Black, 1% Hispanic, 0.4% Asian, and 0.2% Other.

# Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Programs in Louisiana

#### **APRN Students**

- In the 2012-2013 report year, there was an 11% increase in the number of students admitted to APRN programs in Louisiana when compared to the previous report year.
- Over the past year there was an overall 7% increase in the number of students enrolled in Louisiana's APRN programs, an increase but not as significant when compared to the 26% increase between 2011 and 20120
- There was a 15% increase in enrollment in NP programs over the past year and a 62% increase in enrollment since 2009.
- There was a 27% decrease in the number enrolled in CRNA programs when compared to a 25% increase in the previous year.
- In 2012-2013 there was a 6% decrease in the number of males enrolled in APRN programs compared to a 60% increase observed in 2011-20120
- In the 2012-2013 report year, there were a total of 323 graduates from Louisiana's APRN programs which represents a 5% increase when compared to the 307 graduates in the previous report year (2011-2012); The majority of the graduates were from NP programs (79%) and CRNA programs (20%).

# **Non-Licensure Graduate Nursing Students**

- Of the 813 students admitted to graduate nursing programs across the state, 553 (68%) were admitted to APRN programs, 253 (31%) were admitted to Nursing Administration programs, and 7 (0.9%) were admitted to Nursing Education programs in 2012-2013.
- Of the 1,648 students enrolled in graduate nursing programs across the state, 1,188 (72%) were enrolled in APRN programs, 434 (26%) were enrolled in Nursing Administration programs, and 26 (2%) were enrolled in Nursing Education programs during the 2012-2013 report year.
- There were 26 RN students enrolled in the state's Nursing Education programs during the 2012-2013 report year, which represents a 41% decrease from the previous year and a 63% decrease since 2010.

- Almost a third (31%) of the students enrolled in Louisiana's non-licensure graduate nursing programs were between 31 and 40 years of age, 34% were between 41 and 50 years, and 22% were 51 and older0
- The majority of the graduates from non-licensure graduate nursing programs in 2012-2013 were from Nurse Administration programs (172) and 18 were from Nursing Education programs.

# **Faculty Teaching in Graduate Nursing Programs**

- Seventy-two percent of the faculty teaching in Louisiana's graduate nursing programs held an earned doctorate compared to 76% in 2011-2012 (Table 72). A Master's was the highest degree held by 28% of the 190 faculty teaching in graduate nursing programs in Louisiana in 2012-2013.
- The majority of faculty teaching in graduate nursing programs in Louisiana are female (83%) and White (77%). There was a 23% increase in the number of male faculty, as well as a 23% increase in the number of female faculty since the previous report year.
- There was an 18% increase in the number of White graduate nursing faculty (+22 Faculty) and a 32% increase in the number of Black faculty (+9 Faculty) during the 2012-2013 report year0
- Fifty-eight percent (58%) of the faculty teaching in graduate nursing programs in Louisiana were 51 and over in the 2012-2013 report year, whereas only 20% of the graduate nursing faculty teaching in Louisiana's graduate nursing programs were 40 and younger.

# NURSING SUPPLY: AVAILABLE RN NURSING WORKFORCE IN LOUISIANA 2012-2013

The Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) collects demographic information about Louisiana's registered nurse workforce as a component of the licensure renewal process. The target population for the nursing supply data for 2013 includes all registered nurses that held an active unencumbered license to practice as a registered nurse (RN) in Louisiana any time between February 1, 2013 and January 31, 2014. Descriptive analysis of the RN supply data, along with findings based on the analysis of the data, is being presented in the 2013 LSBN Annual Report.

# Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

The Louisiana Nurse Practice Act requires annual license renewal for registered nurses. The LSBN is the state appointed agency assigned to implement, regulate, and monitor the issuance of a license to practice as a RN in the state of Louisiana. In 2013, 60,508 nurses held a license to practice as a RN in Louisiana. Of the 60,508 RNs holding a Louisiana license, 52,556 (87%) lived in Louisiana, while 7,927 (13%) reported home addresses outside of Louisiana. Over the past five years, there was an 11% increase in the number of RNs holding a license to practice nursing in Louisiana, a 12% increase in the number of RNs licensed and residing in Louisiana, and a 5% increase in the number of RNs that do not reside in Louisiana but hold a license to practice in Louisiana (Table 56).

#### Age Ranges for Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

The average age for RNs licensed in Louisiana in 2013 was 45 years and the median age was 44 years. The average age for RNs nationwide is 50 years (National Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses, 2013). There has been a 3% decrease in the number of licensed RNs that were less than 30 years of age and a 10% increase in the number of licensed RNs that were 60 and over (Table 57). Since 2010, the number of licensed RNs that are 60 and over has increased by 58%. Over a third (37%) of the licensed RNs in Louisiana are 39 and younger, while 38% are 50 and over. Twenty-four percent or almost one fourth of licensed RNs residing in Louisiana are between 40 and 49 years of age.

# Gender of Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

The gender distribution for the U.S. population is 49.2% males and 50.8% females, which does not differ significantly from that of the gender distribution for Louisiana which is 48.9% male and 51.1% female (U.S. Census Bureau, 2014). Yet, the gender distribution for RNs in Louisiana is not reflective of the state or national percentages. In Louisiana, males have consistently represented 11% of the RN workforce and females 89% for the past five years (Table 58). According to a U.S. Census Bureau Study released on February 25, 2013, the proportion of male RNs has more than tripled since 1970, from 2.7% to 9.6%. Although there has been a 3% increase in the number of licensed male RNs in Louisiana over the last year, the overall percentage has remained stagnant.

#### **Ethnicity of Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana**

According to the U.S. Census Bureau (2014) minorities comprise approximately 37% of the U.S. population. In the U.S., Hispanics represent 17% of the population, Blacks 13%, Asians 5%, American Indian and Alaska Native 1%, and Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders 0.2%. In Louisiana, minorities represent 40% of the population. Hispanics in Louisiana represent 5% of the population, Blacks 32%, Asians 2%, American Indian and Alaska Native 0.7%, and Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders less than 0.1%. In 2013, the racial make-up of the RN workforce in Louisiana was 80% White, 15% Black, 2% Hispanic (an increase of 8% when compared to 2012), 1% Asian, .4% Native American, and 0.4% other race (Table 59).

# Basic Educational Preparation of Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

Nationally, 36% of the respondents to the 2013 National Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses reported their basic nursing education beginning with the baccalaureate degree in nursing. In 2013, 46% of the licensed RNs residing in Louisiana reported that their basic educational preparation began at the baccalaureate degree level, which is a 3% increase when compared to 2012 and a 13% increase since 2009. An increase was not noted in the percentage of licensed RNs residing in Louisiana that reported their basic nursing education beginning at the AD or Diploma level. There continues to be a decline in the number of licensed RNs reporting their basic educational preparation at the diploma level (Table 60). In 2013, over one thousand RNs (1,135) reported that they were licensed as an LPN prior to becoming an RN, which represents a 3% increase (+29) since 2012.

# Highest Degree Held by Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

According to the 2013 National Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses, 61% of the respondents to the study indicated that they obtained a baccalaureate or higher degree. Findings from the Health Resources and Services Administration (2013) study using 2008-2010 data from the American Community Survey indicated that 55% of RNs reported their highest degree as a baccalaureate or higher. In Louisiana, 61% of licensed RNs residing in Louisiana hold a baccalaureate or higher degree (including Bachelor's or Masters degrees in other disciplines) and 52% have a baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing (including a doctorate in a related field). The highest degree in nursing held by 5% of the RN workforce is the diploma (6% in 2012), 32% report the associate degree as being their highest educational

preparation (33% in 2012), 41% the baccalaureate degree (20% in 2012), and 11% the Masters/Doctorate compared to 10% Masters/Doctorate in 2012 (Table 61).

Licensed RNs residing in Louisiana having doctorates in nursing reflected a 19% increase between 2012 and 2013, and a 75% increase over the past five years (Table 62). There was a 39% increase in the number of licensed RNs with a DNP when compared to the previous year and an 11% increase in those with a DNS. The number of licensed RNs in Louisiana with a PhD in nursing decreased by 1% (-1) and the number with a doctorate in another field decreased by 2% (-4) over the past year.

# **Education Progression**

One of the recommendations from the Institute of Medicine Report on the Future of Nursing: *Leading Change, Advancing Health* addressed the importance of nurses achieving higher levels of education through an improved education system that promotes seamless academic progression (2011). In 2013, two questions related to education progression were added to the licensure renewal application in an effort to begin tracking Louisiana's progress in this area. Over 3,700 (3,749) licensed RNs residing in Louisiana indicated that they were currently enrolled in school which is equivalent to 7% of the 52,556 licensed RNs residing in Louisiana. Of those that were currently enrolled, 1,342 (36%) indicated that they were enrolled in a baccalaureate in nursing program, 1,721 (46%) were enrolled in a Master's in Nursing program, and 411 (11%) were enrolled in various types of doctoral programs. A total of 275 (7%) of licensed RNs reported being enrolled in non-nursing baccalaureate or Masters' programs. There has been a 115% increase in the number of RNs enrolled in Louisiana's RN to BSN programs over the past four years and an 84% increase the number of graduates (Table 63).

## Number of Years Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana Plan to Work

In 2013, 7,422 (14%) licensed RNs reported that they plan to work an additional 1-5 years as an RN and 19% plan to work an additional 6-10 years, which is equivalent to approximately 33% or one-third of licensed RNs in Louisiana reporting that they plan to be out of the nursing workforce within the next 10 years (Table 64).

# **Employment Distribution of Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana**

Eighty-seven percent (87%) of the licensed RNs residing in Louisiana were employed in a position requiring a RN license in 2013; 73% (38,385) full-time, 10% (5,320) part-time, and 4% (2,057) per diem (Table 65). Between 2012 and 2013 there was a 15% increase in the number of licensed RNs in Louisiana that reported working per diem. Nationally, 82% of RN licensees were actively employed in nursing and 60% were employed full-time (National Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses, 2013). Between 2009 and 2013, there was an overall 27% increase in the number of licensed RNs in Louisiana reporting that they were not employed.

Nurses that were not employed indicated that they were either unemployed and seeking a nursing position (1,445) or unemployed not seeking work as a nurse (2,776).

### **Employers of Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana**

Although the percentage of RNs employed by hospitals in 2013 was 57% compared to 56% in 2012, there was a slight decrease in the actual number (-29) of RNs employed in hospitals when compared to the previous report year. There was a 10% increase in the number of nurses employed in home health in the current report year compared to the previous report year. Over the past five years, the area with the greatest growth in the number of employed licensed RNs was home health (24% increase).

# Positions Held by Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

Sixty-three percent (33,106) of RNs licensed in Louisiana in 2013 were employed as staff nurses. Approximately 10% (5,411) of the licensed RNs were nurse mangers, 7% (3,762) APRNs, 3% (1,440) faculty, and 2% (1,188) administrators (Table 68). The positions showing the greatest growth in numbers over the last year were APRNs and administrators. There was a 4% decrease in the number of faculty positions held by licensed RNs between in the current report year.

# Major Clinical, Teaching or Practice Areas Reported by Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

As noted in Table 69, five clinical, teaching, or practice areas in Louisiana with the largest number of RNs (licensed and residing in Louisiana) in 2013 were: medical-surgical units (7,221); acute care/critical care (5,475); OR/PACU (3,555), emergency room/trauma (3,404); and general practice/adult family health (2,595). There has been an 11% decrease in the number of licensed RNs practicing in a medical-surgical area, and a 16% decrease in the number practicing in acute care/critical care when compared to the previous report year.

# Licensed Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana Providing Direct Patient Care in 2013

Nurses are the single largest component of the health care workforce and they provide the majority of direct care to patients (Institute of Medicine Report on the Future of Nursing, 2011; National Advisory Council on Nurse Education and Practice, 2008). This is true not only for the nation, but also for Louisiana. The majority of RNs licensed and residing in Louisiana in 2013 (79%) reported that they provided direct patient care in their practice (Table 70).

# Salaries from Positions held as a Registered Nurse Living in Louisiana

Of the 38,343 RNs licensed and residing in LA in 2013 that reported working full-time, 46% (17,698) reported annual salaries between \$50,001 and \$75,000 (Table 70a). Twenty percent (20%) of the full-time RN workforce reported receiving annual salaries between \$35,001 to \$50,000 and 19% reported receiving salaries between \$75,001 and \$100,000. There was an 8% increase in the number of RNs working full-time reporting annual salaries between \$100,001 and \$150,000 and a 7% increase in the number reporting annual salaries greater than \$150,000 from positions held as RNs.

Approximately 5,308 RNs licensed and residing in LA reported that they worked part-time in 2013. Over two thousand (2,057) licensed RNs residing in Louisiana reported that they were working per diem. Approximately 22% of the per diem RNs reported salaries of less than \$15,000 per year and 22% also reported salaries between \$35,001 and \$50,000. # **Advanced Practice Registered Nurses**

There was a 24% increase in the number of APRNs holding a license to practice in Louisiana between 2009 and 2013. The number of APRNs licensed and residing in Louisiana has also increased by 25% over the past five years, while the number of licensed APRNs residing outside of Louisiana has increased by 18% (Table 71). Eight percent of the licensed RNs in Louisiana are licensed to practice as an APRN.

## Roles of Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Employed and Residing in Louisiana

In 2013, 60% (2,482) of all APRNs licensed and residing in Louisiana were nurse practitioners, 30% (1,244) were Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists, 3% (133) were Clinical Nurse Specialists, and 0.6% (25) were Certified Nurse Midwives (Table 72). There was a 40% increase in the number of NPs licensed and residing in Louisiana between 2009 and 2013 and a 13% increase between 2012 and 2013. The number of Clinical Nurse Specialist licensed and residing in Louisiana decreased by 25% since 2009. The number of APRNs reporting not working as an APRN decreased by 2% between 2012 and 2013.

# **Employment Status for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Residing in LA**

The majority of APRNs in Louisiana were employed full-time (82%). Nine percent (9%) reported part-time employment and 3% were not employed (Table 76). There was a 3% increase in the number of APRNs employed full-time since the previous report year and a 15% increase in the number employed on a part-time basis as an APRN. There was also a 5% decrease in the number of APRNs that were not employed when compared to 2012.

# Clinical Setting for Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana

Forty-four percent (44%) of APRNs in Louisiana work in some type of ambulatory care setting and 38% work in hospitals (Table 77). Between 2012 and 2013 the clinical settings with the greatest increase in the number of APRNs employed were: urban clinic (68%†); HIV/AIDS clinic (43%†); medicine clinic (40%†); nursing home (37%†); pediatric clinic (34%†); and physician's office (30%†). Between 2010 and 2013, the greatest increase in the number of APRNs employed has been in the nursing home (150%†).

# Advanced Practice Registered Nurses Residing in Louisiana with Prescriptive Authority

Sixty-one percent (2,500) of licensed APRNs residing in Louisiana had prescriptive authority in the current report year. The number of licensed APRNs having prescriptive authority in Louisiana increased by 48% between 2009 and 2013, with a 13% increase noted between 2012 and 2013 (Table 78).

# NURSING SUPPLY: AVAILABLE RN NURSING WORKFORCE IN LOUISIANA

# **Major Findings 2013**

- In 2013, 60,508 nurses held a license to practice as a RN in Louisiana. Of the 60,508 RNs holding a Louisiana license, 52,556 (87%) lived in Louisiana, while 7,927 (13%) reported home addresses outside of Louisiana.
- Over the past five years, there has been a 11% increase in the number of RNs holding a license to practice in Louisiana0
- The average age for RNs licensed in Louisiana in 2013 was 45 years and the median age was 44 years. The average age for RNs nationwide is 50 years (2013 National Workforce Survey of Registered Nurses, 2013).
- Over a third (38%) of the licensed RNs residing in Louisiana are 50 years and older0
- According to the U.S. Census Bureau (2014) minorities comprise approximately 37% of the U.S. population; minorities represent 40% of Louisiana's population; 20% of licensed RNs residing in Louisiana represent minorities.
- In 2013, 46% of the licensed RNs residing in Louisiana reported that their basic educational preparation began at the baccalaureate degree level, which is a 3% increase when compared to 2012 and a 13% increase since 2009.
- In 2013, over one thousand RNs (1,135) reported that they were licensed as an LPN prior to becoming a RN, which represents a 3% increase (+29) since 2012.
- In Louisiana, 61% of licensed RNs residing in Louisiana hold a baccalaureate or higher degree (including Bachelor's or Masters degrees in other disciplines) and 52% have a baccalaureate or higher degree in nursing (including a doctorate in a related field).
- Licensed RNs residing in Louisiana having doctorates in nursing reflected a 19% increase between 2012 and 2013 and a 75% increase over the past five years0
- There was a 39% increase in the number of licensed RNs with a DNP when compared to the previous year and an 11% increase in those with a DNS. The number of licensed RNs in Louisiana with a PhD in nursing decreased by 1% (-1) and the number with a doctorate in another field decreased by 2% (-4) over the past year.
- Over 3,700 licensed RNs residing in Louisiana indicated that they were currently enrolled in school which is equivalent to 7% of the 52,556 licensed RNs. Of those that were currently enrolled, 1,342 (36%) indicated that they were enrolled in a baccalaureate in nursing program; 1,721 (46%) were enrolled in a Master's in Nursing program, and 411 (11%) were enrolled in various types of doctoral programs.
- Approximately 33% of licensed RNs in Louisiana reported that they plan to be out of the nursing workforce within the next 10 years0
- Eighty-seven percent of the licensed RNs residing in Louisiana were employed in a position requiring a RN license in 2013; 73% (38,385) full-time, 10% (5,320) part-time, and 4% (2,057) per diem0
- There was a 2% increase in the number of licensed RNs that reported that they were not employed.
- The percentage of RNs employed by hospitals in 2013 was 57% compared to 56% in 20120
- Over the past five years, the area with the greatest growth in the number of employed licensed RNs was home health (24% increase).

- Five clinical, teaching, or practice areas in Louisiana with the largest number of RNs employed (licensed and residing in Louisiana) in 2013 were: medical-surgical units (7,221); acute care/critical care (5,475); OR/PACU (3,555), emergency room/trauma (3,404); and general practice/adult family health (2,595).
- The majority of RNs licensed and residing in Louisiana in 2013 (79%) reported that they provided direct patient care in their practice0

# **Advanced Practice Registered Nurses in Louisiana**

- There was a 24% increase in the number of APRNs holding a license to practice in Louisiana between 2009 and 2013.
- In 2013, 60% (2,482) of all APRNs licensed and residing in Louisiana were Purse Rractitioners, 30% (1,244) were Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists, 3% (133) were Clinical Nurse Specialists, and 0.6% (25) were Certified Nurse Midwives0
- Over one third (36%) of licensed APRNs in Louisiana are 50 years older and older0
- Twenty-three percent of APRNs in Louisiana are male, whereas only 11% of all licensed RNs residing in Louisiana are male0
- Minorities represent approximately 16% of licensed APRNs in Louisiana0
- The majority of APRNs in Louisiana are employed full-time (82%), with 9% reported employed part-time, and 3% were not employed0
- Forty-four percent (44%) of APRNs in Louisiana work in some type of ambulatory care setting and 38% worked in hospitals0
- Between 2012 and 2013 the clinical settings with the greatest increase in the number of APRNs employed were: urban clinic (68%↑); HIV/AIDS clinic (43%↑); medicine clinic (40%↑); nursing home (37%↑); pediatric clinic (34%↑); and physician's office (30%↑).
