- The mid-accreditation report submitted to CCNE from Louisiana College was accepted and they received continued accreditation with their next site visit in Fall 2012.
- Notification received from Louisiana College of their intent to add an Accelerated BSN track to the existing BSN Program. The program is an intensive, twelve month, cohort-arranged delivery to begin in June 2009.
- Notice received from Baton Rouge Community College that the position of Dean for Nursing and Allied Health is vacant. Dr. Bradley Ebersole, Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs, is serving as interim dean while a search for a new dean is conducted. Dr. Anna Cazes is serving as the chairperson of the nursing program.
- Our Lady of the Lake College, Nurse Anesthesia Program, has made minor modifications to the CRNA curriculum.
- Two registered nurses from Louisiana, Soledad Mujica Smith and Laura Martien, were chosen by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing as alternates for the 2009 TOEFL iBT English Proficiency Standard Setting Panel.
- Southeastern Louisiana University will end its accreditation with NLNAC on December 31, 2008 now that they have received accreditation of their undergraduate and graduate programs with CCNE.
- Letter of apology received from Pearson VUE related to scheduling of the NCLEX Member Board exam review.

Dr. Steele requested that Louisiana College separate the results of the graduates from the existing BSN Program and the Accelerated BSN track to see success rate.

Dr. Poirrier announced that the University of Louisiana Lafayette and McNeese State University will end its accreditation with NLNAC on December 31, 2008 now that the Consortium has received accreditation for graduate programs with CCNE. The University of Louisiana Lafayette will also end its accreditation with NLNAC on December 31, 2008 for their undergraduate program in nursing since

receiving accreditation with CCNE. McNeese State University will continue with NLNAC for their undergraduate programs.
