Historical Perspective:	<ul> <li>3.1 Staff reported on the limitations of the current Law (RS 37:930) regarding RNs administering anesthetic agents and distributed a copy of the Louisiana Civil Code, reference Art.11. Meaning of words, see attachment #1</li> <li>3.2 The Board's summary statement regarding RNs administering analgesic doses of anesthetic agents and all the related advisory opinions were distributed, see attachment #2.</li> </ul>
Advisory Opinion Petitions:	4.1 Members were appraised of the three advisory opinion requests before the Board's Practice Committee, copies of the opinion requests and related materials were distributed, see attachment #3.

New Business:	<ul> <li>5.1 Following is a summary statement of the Task Force members concerns, special interest, * denotes that more than one member addressed the point:</li> <li>*-epidural pain management is a safe practice, patients experience fewer post-op complications and are discharges sooner</li> <li>*-literature documents effective pain management with analgesic doses of Marcaine</li> <li>*-RNs managing epidurals for pain management have documented special training, recognize possible complications, and agencies have clearly stated policies/procedures</li> <li>~no reported complications over the past 8 years</li> <li>*-patients receive deep sedation for a brief period of time, a physician is at the bedside with the patient</li> <li>*-RNs are ACLS certified, practice has evolved for RNs with specialized training to work collaboratively with the physicians to monitor patients receiving moderate to deep sedation in cath labs and ICUs (physicians administer the drugs), resources are readily available if patients experience any adverse effects</li> <li>~change the Nurse Practice Act</li> <li>~Limited number of cases RNs would monitor, CRNA education requires 3500 hours of epidurals, 400 intubations, 600 masks, challenged RN competency to monitor patients under deep sedation for procedures, areas of study:</li> <li>~To determine if any of the three issues (epidural administration of anesthetic agents) are appropriate for the non-anesthesia RN to deliver safe, quality care to the citizens of LA.</li> <li>~To determine if pain management clinical guidelines that provide for appropriate, safe care of patients are in conflict with RS 37:930, meet intent or exceed scope of the Law).</li> <li>~To determine if there is a need for an attorney's review of the Law and to review the results/actions related to the Task Force decisions.</li> </ul>
