Submit to a comprehensive psychiatric, psychological evaluation by a psychiatrist and clinical psychologist who have been approved by the Board.

Shall authorize and cause a written report of the said evaluation to be submitted to the Board. Shall include the entire evaluation report, including diagnosis, course of treatment, prescribed or recommended treatment, prognosis and professional opinion as to registrant's capability of practicing nursing with reasonable skill and safety to patients.

Immediately submit to all recommendations thereafter of the therapist, physician, or treatment team, and cause to have submitted evidence of continued compliance with all recommendations by the respective professionals. This stipulation shall continue until the registrant is fully discharged by the respective professionals and until approved by Board staff.

If the evaluations give any treatment recommendations or findings to warrant concern for patient safety, shall meet with Board or Board staff. Must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that she poses no danger to the practice of nursing or to the public and that she can safely and competently perform the duties as a registered nurse.

If the Board approves licensure, a period of probation along with supportive conditions or stipulations will be required to ensure that patients and the public are protected.

Prior to reinstatement, submit payment of \$1500 to the Board as a fine, and payment of \$600 to the Board as cost of this hearing.

Failure to comply with the above orders, receipt of an unfavorable report may result in further disciplinary action.

The information and data regarding the operation of the Board office from October 1 to December 31, 2005 was mailed out to Board members.

A March 2006 Addendum report of the Executive Director was distributed.

There are now over 33, 000 licensees who have renewed as of this date of which 30,000 have renewed online. The deadline for renewal is March 31, 2006.

One licensing analyst position and one licensing assistant position have been filled. The administrative assistant position and one licensing analyst position have been accepted and those individuals will be coming March 13. There is still a vacancy for four (4) licensing analysts, four (4) licensing assistants and one (1) accounting specialist positions.

At the January, 2006 Special Call Board meeting, the Board authorized the Executive Director to continue to negotiate with the Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH) and to authorize draft rules implementing medication administration by trained direct service workers.
