| Old Business<br>Agenda item 4.1 | Report on Criminal Background Checks   |
|                                 | Director of Credentialing and Practice (M. Griener) discussed the criminal background check process. Each applicant submits the appropriate application with a criminal background check and the date of 11/11/1911 is entered. This date remains until the Board has received a criminal background check report back from the State Police and FBI. Recently the Board completed an audit for every active nurse who still had the date of 11/11/1011 in the Nurse Trace system. |

of 11/11/1911 in the Nurse Trac system.

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Criminal background check status and each nurse received a letter letting them know they need to submit the criminal background check, forms and fee before renewing their 2009 license. She stated that approximately 700 letters were sent out and the Board is in the process of getting those completed.

M. Griener also stated that now the Board has the ability to process the background checks on site with the new equipment that was recently purchased. This equipment allows for a much quicker turnaround with the results without having to wait weeks for the reports

L. Agosta questioned when was the background check started and how far back did the reports come from.

M. Griener stated the rule was passed in FY2000 that each applicant must have a current background check to practice. The audit was pulled for active nurses who were licensed since FY2000 and still had the 11/11/1911 dates on record.

M. Griener discussed that once the report is returned from Louisiana State Police and FBI the 11/11/1911 dates are removed and replaced with the current date. Once the current date is in place the nurse can go online to renew their license for FY2010.

Agenda item 4.2 Licensure Verification (NurSys Information – Date Entry)

M. Griener stated this project is coming to an end and hoping to be finished by the first week of November. The Board still had 2 employees that are inputting the information for the verification system. The Board was granted \$65,000 dollars by National Council for this project and has approximately \$10,000 dollars left to finish.

L. Agosta confirmed there is a fee to be paid to receive this verification for the Louisiana license.

M. Griener stated the fee is paid directly to NurSys and not to the Board in the amount of \$30 per state they want verified. This information is generally received within hours instead of processing thru the mail.

L. Haley questioned how the information is verified for an advanced practice registered nurse with certification.

M. Griener confirmed that advanced practice registered nurses are not verified with NurSys. The registered nurse information can be verified. Many states still only recognize advanced practice registered nurses and do not fully license advanced practice registered nurses, therefore NurSys will only verify the registered nurse information.
