Shall remain free of alcohol, alcohol-based products and all unprescribed mood altering substances. Any mood altering, addictive or dependency-inducing substances must be currently prescribed for a bona fide medical condition by a physician knowledgeable about the individual's history and the information underlying the Board's concerns. All prescribed drugs must be verified in writing to the Board on a specified form by the individual and the prescribing physician within five (5) days of this date and within five (5) days of any new prescriptions. The Board reserves the right to have an LSBN recognized addictionist review and approve the prescriptions for continued nursing practice.

Failure to comply with the above orders, receipt of an unfavorable report, or non-receipt of reports on or before the date due shall result in the immediate denial of the Respondent's eligibility to reinstate.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

The report from the first quarter fiscal year, July 1, 2006 through September 30, 2006, was distributed to Board members.

Ms. Morvant introduced Melodie Knippers, new staff RN Regional Manager, and reported that Dr. Elaine Vallette will be coming January 8th to the Board as the Director of Education. RN Manager for Practice position is still being recruited. A position for an additional Regional Manager for Compliance is being created.

Jeanine Ennis, Human Resources Analyst, accepted a promotionary position with Department of Health and Hospitals (DHH). An employment offer is pending to an individual to fill the Human Resources Analyst position.

Three Licensure Analysts positions and two Licensure Assistant positions are still being recruited.

The Year-to-Date figures on page 11 of the Executive Director's report have to be removed as they were inadvertently left on the form from last fiscal year's numbers.

Renewals are going well. Post cards were sent out to all licensees who registered on-line last year. The licensees who did not renew on line were sent a renewal packet that offered them the opportunity to renew online and alerted them that the intent of the Board was to require on-line renewals in 2008. A full report will be given after renewals are completed.

The on-line verification system has been redesigned and is back up and running. This should reduce the number of fax verifications received from institutions trying to verify individuals for employment, but will increase the number of public record's request.

The Attorney General's opinion request regarding participation in the Nurse Licensure Compact was received, which was originally initiated on behalf of the Nursing Supply and Demand Commission. That opinion has been published and essentially says that participation in the licensure compact is unconstitutional.

As was reported by the President, the LSBN is now the owner of a building. The building cannot be occupied by the Board until after renovations are made.
