Dear Ms. Lauve:

Pursuant to your request as to whether it is within the scope of practice for a critical care registered nurse to administer the following classifications of drugs for rapid intubation for emergent airway management in a patient having an acute, life-threatening airway event: Neuromuscular Blocking agents, propofol and etomidate with a critical care Intensivist (MD) present performing the intubation in any setting in response to a "code or emergency, the Board rendered the following nurse practice opinion:

Board upholds the previous opinion 96.07 in regard to rapid sequence induction/intubation and further approves that it is within the scope of practice for the RN as member of a rapid response team to administer medications at the direction of the attending physician who is present and has designated the situation as an emergency (an acute, life-threatening event) with the following provisos:

- 1. The physician has ordered the rapid sequence induction/intubation, medication to be administered and is present at the bedside.
- 2. There is institutional policy and procedure developed to guide the RN in this emergency process.
- 3. The nurse has the knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the medication administration.
- 4. All equipment needed for resuscitation, hemodynamic support, and monitoring is available at the bedside.
- 5. The competency of the registered nurse is verified and documentation of competency is contained in the file of the registered nurse. The competency is renewed and documented annually.
