Dear Mrs. Penton:

On November 30, 1984, the Board of Nursing deliberated on the questions you asked regarding the legal definition of the practice of a registered nurse. The opinion of the Board on each of your questions follows:

1. Changing tracheostomy tubes in a hospital situation: In an emergency a registered nurse who has the appropriate knowledge and skills may change the tracheostomy tube.

In non-emergency situations, a registered nurse should assess the patient and use nursing judgment, based on his/her competency, as to whether or not (s)he will carry out an order or perform a procedure.

Considering the possible complications of the procedure, the nurse must be adequately prepared to intervene in the event of any complication.

Administration of Pentothal: Except for registered nurses who are covered under L.R.S. 37:930, it is not within the realm of the legal practice of the registered nurse to administer pentothal to a patient.

The monitoring of the patient having received pentothal for purposes other than anesthesia (analgesia, sedation, etc.) is within the realm of the legal practice of a registered nurse.
